SUBJECT: Constitutional Amendment

At the Annual Meeting of the American Association of Avian Pathologists in Salt Lake City, Utah the Board endorsed the amendment to the constitution to eliminate the 3 year requirement for AAAP membership.

Article IV, Section 2, Paragraph 2 - Members

(a) to be left unchanged

(b) which now reads
"Have satisfactory moral and ethical standings in
the profession and a minimum of three years
experience in avian diseases."

Article IV, Section 2, Paragraph 4 - Associate Members

(a) which now reads
"Veterinarians who are U. S. residents but are not
members of the AVMA and persons without a degree in
veterinary medicine who have been engaged in some
phase of avian pathology for a minimum of three
years and who have made significant contributions
to the knowledge in this field."
