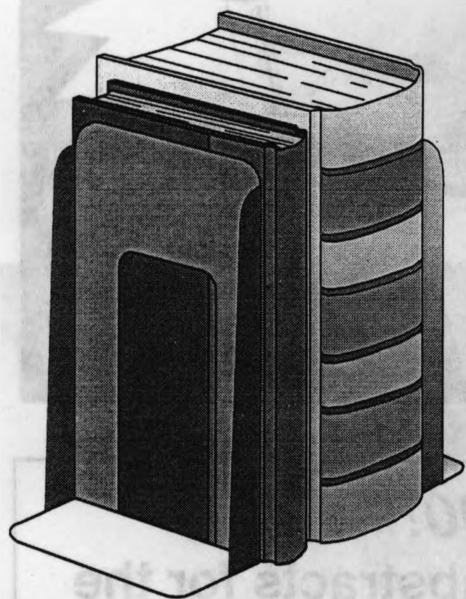

## **LIFE MEMBERSHIP**

**Deadline for submissions: February 2, 2001**

### **Introduction:**

Life membership is a special category to which charter members, members, and associate members, upon entering retirement, may be elected following nomination. Life members will not be required to pay any dues or assessments.

### **Qualification Criteria:**

The following criteria must be fulfilled to be considered for election:

1. The candidate must have been active in the field of poultry health for a minimum of 25 years.
2. The candidate must have made significant contributions to the American Association of Avian Pathologists. Examples of significant contributions are serving on the Board of Directors, and/or serving on committees of the AAAP such as the Editorial Boards associated with the AAAP (Diseases of Poultry, Avian Diseases, Isolation and Identification of Avian Pathogens, etc.), Awards Committee, and/or other committees essential for the AAAP.
3. The candidate must have made significant contributions to the field of poultry health.

Equal weight will be given to criteria 2 and 3 in the decision to elect the candidate to life membership. Retirement is interpreted to mean that the member or associate member has retired from major gainful employment. Nominations will be accepted from AAAP members. Nominations for election as life members will be submitted to the Awards Committee, approved by the Awards Committee, and approved by a two-thirds vote of the Governing Board.

### **Documents to be submitted for nominations:**

1. A cover letter is the letter of nomination.
2. Submit evidence that the candidate fulfills all criteria (less than two pages total). The following items should be included:
  - a. Documentation that the candidate's activity in the field of poultry health began at least 25 years prior to the year in which life membership is to be awarded.
  - b. A list of the significant contributions made by the candidate to AAAP.
  - c. A list of the significant contributions made by the candidate to the field of poultry health.
  - d. Documentation that the candidate has retired from major gainful employment.
3. Complete curriculum vitae.

## **Introduction:**

The Special Service Award is given to a person who has made outstanding contributions within the field of avian medicine. These contributions must be demonstrated through scientific work, organizational involvement, and service to fellow colleagues. The award shall be in the amount of \$1000.00 plus travel expenses, if necessary, to the American Veterinary Medical Association's Annual Meeting.

## **Qualification Criteria:**

The nominee shall have made outstanding contributions to avian medicine via scientific work, organizational involvement, and service to colleagues.

## **Awards will be based on the following:**

1. The cover letter is a letter of nomination.
2. Statement of special service. A description of the nature of the activities thought to constitute special service to the field of avian medicine.
3. List of professional positions. In addition, state the length of time and activities associated with those positions.
4. List of memberships in professional organizations associated with avian medicine. In addition, state any activities the nominee has been involved in relating to these organizations.
5. List of awards or honors indicative of prior recognition of service to colleagues and to the field of avian medicine.
6. Statement of impact on other colleagues in the field of avian medicine (local, national, and/or international).
7. Statement estimating the portion of the career which was devoted to activities in the field of avian medicine.
8. Special supportive material pertinent to the nominee's particular area of service (e.g., a bibliography would be suitable for a nominee whose contributions have been largely in the area of research). If a bibliography is submitted, please highlight 5 references that the nominator feels are most significant.

# **C. A. Bottorff Award 2001**

## **Introduction:**

This award was made possible by a generous gift from Dr. Hiram Lasher in honor of Dr. C. A. Bottorff. Dr. Bottorff had an illustrious career as a poultry industry veterinarian with Lederle Laboratories and was actively involved in the early development of the AAAP. He served as vice president in 1965-66 and president in 1966-67. The first award was given in 1988. The C.A. Bottorff Award is given to recognize an avian diagnostician/technical service veterinarian who has contributed significantly to the poultry health program in North America in the past 10 years. The award shall be in the amount of \$1000.00 plus travel expenses, if necessary, to the American Veterinary Medical Association's Annual Meeting.

## **Qualification Criteria:**

The recipient must be a veterinarian, a member of the AAAP, and may be affiliated with a government agency, academia or industry. The criteria for selection of the recipient are:

1. Primary involvement in avian diagnostic work and/or technical service to the poultry industry in the past ten years (laboratory and/or field work).
2. Demonstration of sincere concern and effort to identify and resolve the poultry industry's flock health problems.
3. Documentation of significant contribution to the poultry industry.

## **Awards will be based on the following:**

1. The cover letter is a letter of nomination.
2. No more than three seconding letters.
3. Statement concerning the nominee's involvement and expertise as a diagnostician.
4. Biographical Information 1 - education.
5. Biographical Information 2 - professional position(s).

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# **Bayer-Snoeyenbos New Investigator Award 2001**

**Deadline for submission of nominations: February 2, 2001**

## **Introduction:**

The Bayer-Snoeyenbos New Investigator Award is given to a member or associate member of AAAP whose career as an independent investigator in poultry medicine began less than seven years ago and who during this time has made meritorious research contributions to the avian field. The spirit of the award is to recognize new and upcoming investigators. The award shall be in the amount of \$1000.00 plus travel expenses to the American Veterinary Medical Association's Annual Meeting.

The New Investigator Award was renamed in 1994 in memory of Dr. Glenn Snoeyenbos, because of his excellent contributions to the AAAP and avian medicine. Dr. Snoeyenbos died in 1993. The award was re-named a second time in 1996 in recognition of the \$32,000 donation that the Bayer Poultry Business Unit made in support of the award.

## **Qualification Criteria:**

Nominations for the Bayer-Snoeyenbos New Investigator Award will be accepted from any member of the AAAP. The nominee must be a AAAP member or associate member whose career as an independent investigator in poultry medicine began less than seven years ago and who during this time has made meritorious research contributions to the avian field. This award will be given for special accomplishment in a particular area of investigation or for overall accomplishments during the specified time. This award shall not be made more than once to any one recipient.

## **Awards will be based on the following information:**

1. The cover letter is to be the letter of nomination.
2. No more than two seconding letters.
3. A brief statement of significant contributions to the field of avian medicine.
4. Biographical Information 1: Institution(s) attended, degree(s) granted, and area(s) of study.
5. Biographical Information 2: List of the professional positions held by the nominee. In addition, state the length of time and activities associated with those positions.
6. Any other biographical information considered pertinent to this award.
7. A bibliography.
8. State the 5 publications that are considered by the nominator to be most significant. If these publications are printed in a journal other than Avian Diseases, you may be asked to submit a reprint of the appropriate paper(s). It is not necessary to send any reprints at this time.

# Pharmacia & Upjohn Achievement Award 2001

**Deadline for submissions: February 2, 2001**

## **Introduction:**

The Pharmacia & Upjohn Achievement Award is given to a member of AAAP who has made outstanding contributions to the field of research in avian medicine within the past seven years. The award is not to be given as a recognition of lifetime service unless a substantial portion of that service should represent accomplishments during the 7 years preceding the annual award. Furthermore, the award is not given for a particular piece of research, but for accomplishment during a definite time span; this time is limited to 7 years in order not to penalize younger individuals. The award shall not be given more than once to a recipient.

## **Qualification Criteria:**

The nominee must be a member (any category) of AAAP.

## **Awards will be based on the following:**

1. The cover letter is to be the letter of nomination.
2. No more than one seconding letter.
3. A brief statement of contribution.
4. Biographical Information 1: Institution(s) attended, degree(s) granted, and area(s) of study.
5. Biographical Information 2: List of the professional positions held by the nominee. In addition, state the length of time and activities associated with those positions.
6. Any other biographical information considered pertinent to this award.
7. A pertinent bibliography (past 7 years).
8. State up to 10 publications that are considered by the nominator to be most significant. If these publications are printed in a journal other than Avian Diseases or Poultry Science, you may be asked to submit a reprint of the appropriate paper(s). It is not necessary to send any reprints at this time.

# **Reed Rumsey Award 2001**

**Deadline for submission: February 2, 2001**

## **Introduction:**

Reed Rumsey was elected president of the AAAP in July 1979, after having served as vice president during 1978-79 and on the Board of Directors in 1976-78. Tragically, he developed cancer and resigned in January, 1980. Highly respected by his peers in the industry and academia, he also had great faith in young people and the future of the poultry industry. Shortly before his death, Dr. Rumsey announced that he would bequeath \$25,000 to the AAAP for the establishment of a student award program for the advancement of avian medicine. The American Association of Avian Pathologists annually selects an outstanding student(s) to be the recipient of the Reed Rumsey Student Award for Advancement of Avian Medicine.

## **Qualification Criteria:**

Applicants must be either students (that are currently in veterinary school or have received their D.V.M. degree in the previous year), residents, or interns pursuing an existing program in a College of Veterinary Medicine or appropriate department in an academic institution.

- a. Graduate students must be concurrently pursuing or have already received their D.V.M. degree.
- b. Veterinary students (enrolled in a college of veterinary medicine) may be considered if they are doing research or have a case report to submit.
- c. Residents or interns (following a D.V.M. degree) must be participating in an avian medicine training program.

The award(s) shall be competitive and given in addition to any stipend given by the academic institution. Initially the award(s) shall be in the amount of \$1,000 plus travel expenses to the American Veterinary Medical Association's meeting. The number of awards to be given will be determined by the AAAP Board each year. Two awards were given in 2000.

## **Awards will be based on the following:**

1. Submission of a one-to-two page abstract describing the original research or a case study conducted by the applicant. Those selected to receive the award will be expected to present their research or case report at the Avian Medicine Section of the Annual Meeting of the American Veterinary Medical Association.
2. Copy of current curriculum vitae.
3. Transcript of grades (graduate work for those in graduate school, veterinary school transcript for those professional students not concurrently in graduate school). A progress report will suffice for those in a residency or internship program.
4. Narrative statement by the applicant (1-2 pages) outlining career goals and plans for the future. In addition, the applicant should comment on how their graduate/ residency/ internship/ professional school program and research/case study has helped them move towards these goals.

5. A supporting letter from the major professor or someone else from the institution qualified to comment on the quality of the applicant. This letter should contain a distinct paragraph stating that the applicant qualifies according to the criteria stated in section labeled "Qualification Criteria".

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# **Pfizer Excellence in Poultry Research Award 2002**

**Deadline for submission of nominations: February 2, 2001**

## **Introduction:**

The recipient of the Pfizer Excellence in Poultry Research Award is selected by the American Veterinary Medical Foundation and presented to a member of the AVMA holding the D.V.M. degree for **sustained excellence in research in poultry disease and health over a period of 20 years or more.** The award shall be in the amount of \$500.00 plus travel expenses and per diem costs for two days to the American Veterinary Medical Association's Annual Meeting. The recipient is expected to present a paper describing some aspect of her or his research.

The Awards Committee of the American Association of Avian Pathologists will nominate a candidate for this award to the American Veterinary Medical Foundation, but there is no guarantee that our candidate will be the recipient. The AVMF will notify the recipient in advance, therefore there is no need to keep the nomination a secret and nominators can ask their candidate to provide a complete CV and other materials as specified below.

## **Qualification Criteria:**

The nominee must be a member of the AVMA and must hold the DVM degree, which are both AVMF requirements, and must be active in research or not more than one year into retirement. The candidate must have a record of sustained excellence in poultry disease or health research.

## **Awards will be based on the following information:**

1. Cover letter to nominate the candidate. (Self-nominations are not acceptable following AVMF rules.)
2. No more than one seconding letter.
3. A one page, single-spaced summary of research accomplishments (which may be written by the candidate) outlining the contributions to poultry medicine and /or health over at least a period of 20 years or more.
4. A complete CV, including biographical information such as education (institution(s) attended, degree(s) granted, and area(s) of study); list of the professional positions held by the nominee, including the length of time and activities associated with those positions; a complete list of publications; and, if appropriate, a list of trainees and the current positions of the trainees.

5. Any other biographical information considered pertinent by the nominator. For example, a listing of some (less than 10) publications covering the 20 year period that are considered by the nominator to be most significant, or other lasting impacts on the science in the field, would be appropriate.
