# Twenty-eighth Annual Meeting of the American Association of Avian Pathologists standardization. Dr. Beard will be in charge of an ad hoc com-

Las Vegas, Nevada July 24, 1985

The twenty-eighth annual meeting of the American Association of Avian Pathologists was called to order by Dr. Charles Beard, President, at 3:20 p.m. The meeting was attended by approximately 140 members.

Dr. Beard asked for a moment of silence to remember the passing of four AAAP members -- Drs. J. A. Allen, B. Bierer, W. Kirkham and S. Nivas and our only remaining honorary members Mrs. Dorothy Beard.

The minutes of the 27th annual meeting, previously circulated to the membership, were approved.

The Audit Committee report, that the records of the association were in good order, was accepted by the membership.

The following recommendations of the Board of Directors were presented to the membership and approved:

- 1. The Board approved a request from Dr. Ben Pomeroy for a \$1,000 contribution to the Avian Influenza International Symposium to be held next year.
  - 2. Initiated action to maintain our status in AVMA by what ever means necessary. If we do not have 500 members who are members of AVMA then 85% of our voting membership must be AVMA members Dr. Mallinson's committee will work on getting recruiters from each state and trying to get more of our members who are DVMs to join AVMA. and included 88 articles, 19 case reports, 15 resea
  - 3. Dr. Hugo Medina has graciously offered to translate our AVIAN DISEASE MANUAL into Spanish to help our colleagues south of the boarder with diseases of poultry. He is hoping to finish it around the end of the year. Drs. Lucio & Villegas have agreed to edit the text. We are hoping to have it finished in time for the ANECA meeting in Mexico at the end of April 1986.
- 4. The Board has approved a request for support to publish a manual by Dr. Craigmyle Riddell on Avian Histopathology. Dr. Riddell is hoping to complete the manual by next July so publication will be towards the end of 1986.

- 5. There is a great need for poultry laboratory test standardization. Dr. Beard will be in charge of an ad hoc committee to investigate if AAAP can somehow become involved in standardization of poultry laboratory tests and provide reference sera.
- 6. Dr. Eckroade acknowledged receipt of a check from Dr. Calnek in the amount of \$1,910.43 from the symposium on Marek's which was held last July in Ithaca, NY.
  - 7. Dr. Eckroade also acknowledged receipt of a check in the amount of \$5,742.96 from the Salmonella Symposium which was held after the annual meeting last year in New Orleans.
    - 8. The Board voted to increase financial support for the regional meetings from \$1,600 up to \$2,000.
- 9. The Board voted to provide up to \$3,000 to help defray the cost of the 1986 Annual Meeting Symposium "Current Problems in the Poultry Industry -- Case Reports". Dr. Bickford will be the Chairman with Drs. Eckroade, Glisson and Halvorson representing the other 3 regions.
  - 10. Dr. Louis van der Heide was re-elected to represent the Northeastern Region on the Board of Directors for the next 4 years.
  - 11. In their absence the Board voted honorariums of \$6,500 for the Editor of AVIAN DISEASES and the AAAP Business Manager.
  - Dr. Beard explained because the new committee structure was late last year being implimented there would be very little changes in the committees this year.

# - mem AMVA ed deum dim Committee Reports

Editor of AVIAN DISEASES - Volume 28 (1984) was 1159 pages and included 88 articles, 19 case reports, 15 research notes, 5 pet bird medicine articles and the annual disease reports. The acceptance rate is 75-80%.

Dr. Anderson explained a little of the problems we have been having with Arnold Printing and that effective with Volume 30 (1986) we are changing to Allen Press and the journal will be larger with 2 columns on a page with better quality paper and pictures. Dr. Anderson was asked if we would do an accumlative index in the near future. Dr. Anderson said that it had been a long time since one had been done and he would check into it.

2nd International Conference on Avian Influenza - will be held on September 3, 4 and 5, 1986 possibly in Athens, GA. Dr.

Bernie Easterday is Chairman with Dr. Pomeroy in charge of raising funds for this symposium and Drs. Charlie Beard and Dennis Alexander as Vice Chairmen.

AVMA House of Delegates Report - Dr. Beard expressed AAAP's appreciation to Dr. Ben Pomeroy for the fine job he has done over the last 4 years on AAAP's behalf as our alternate and then delegate to the AVMA House of Delegates.

Dr. Pomeroy reported that the animal welfare issue is getting worse not better each year.

The only debated issue in the house this year was over military user fee which the federal government wants to charge the Armed Forces employee for each visit to a military veterinary clinic. The House registered its disapproval of this plan.

There was no action on the site of the 1991 meeting. The 1986 meeting will be in Atlanta, GA

The revised Resolution #10 concerning allied groups represented in the House passed. However we will have to maintain 85% of our voting membership as AVMA members or have 500 members as AVMA members which we do not now have. At the present time according to AVMA we only have 401 of our members as AVMA members in good standing.

Dr. Ed Mallinson will assume the Delegate chair for AAAP and the Board will appoint an alternate delegate tomorrow at the next Board meeting and will announce this person's name in the next newsletter.

Drug Advisory Committee - Dr. van der Heide reported that there is a lot going on in this committee with the possibility of a prescription law change concerning drugs in feed. He will be keeping us posted on what is happening with this committee.

Avian Tumor Virus Committee - Dr. Sharma said that he had extra copies of his committee's report if anyone would like to have one. The report dealt mostly with Marek's and Lymphoid Leukosis.

Disease Reporting & Nomenclature - Dr. Springer reported that SNOVET was adopted for reporting diseases and that the coding guide will be forthcoming.

History of Avian Medicine Committee - Dr. Rosenwald in Dr. Lancaster's absence said that he has received a suggestion of doing a history on avian mycoplasma.

Membership Committee - Dr. Mallinson told the membership we have lots of work to do to maintain our affiliation with AVMA and asked for their help to recruit members from their state.

Life Members - Dr. Beard announced that Drs. Cover, Hofstad, Snoeyenbos and Winterfield were elected Life Members in AAAP members. years on AAAP's behalf as our alternate and then dele-

Awards - The P. P. Levine Award for the best paper appearing in Volume 28 (1984) of AVIAN DISEASES was presented to Dr. L. B. Crittenden by Dr. Beard for his paper entitled "Influence of Endogenous Viral (EV) Gene Expression and Strain of Exogenous Avian Leukosis Virus (ALV) on Mortality and ALV Infection and Shedding in Chickens.

Dr. Marlin Kleckner presented the Upjohn Achievement Award to Dr. Glenn Snoeyenbos of the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, MA for his work with Salmonellosis. meeting. The
