

Resolution Concerning Poultry Inspection

WHEREAS, the Federal poultry inspection program became mandatory in 1960 to serve the third largest producer of farm income estimated at 3.2 Billion dollars, and

WHEREAS, the inspection service is confronted with increasing disease problems encountered in the inspection of dressed poultry and poultry products,

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the American Association of Avian Pathologists at its annual meeting in New York City, July 29, recommends that steps be taken by the American Veterinary Medical Association, The United States Livestock Sanitary Association, The American Poultry and Hatchery Federation, and The Poultry Breeders of America to obtain greater financial support from the Federal government to meet the needs of the poultry inspection service adequately, and

Be it further resolved that the above professional and industry groups be appraised of these needs and their support be solicited.
