# SEE ROOSEVELTS OFF

## CAIRO AND ALEXANDRIA CROWDS GIVE COLONEL A HEARTY FAREWELL

### FAMILY SAILS FOR NAPLES

Missionaries Thank American for Courtesy and Condemnation of Nationalists—Departure Like Arrival Marked by Pleasant Features.

Alexandria, Egypt.—Accompanied by Mrs. Roosevelt, Miss Ethel and Kermit, Col. Theodore Roosevelt bade farewell to Africa and sailed on the steamer Prinz Heinrich Wednesday for Naples.

They were given a hearty welcome and farewell, but had little time to spare while here.

Mr. Roosevelt received here a note of thanks from American missionaries in appreciation of his courtesy to them and his condemnation of the Nationalists in his Cairo address.

Huge crowds awaited the Roosevelts' train and followed the party along the quays to the Prinz Heinrich which was gay with flags, the Stars and Stripes predominating.

At Tanta the colonel was reminded that in 1882 the Moslems pulled Christians from trains and massacred them.

"Yes," said Col. Roosevelt, "that's just what would happen again if you had self-rule in Egypt."

The colonel's departure from Egypt was like his arrival. He goes out absolutely the one dominating feature, the greatest personality of Egypt today.

He was given a rousing send-off when he bade farewell to Cairo and the government officials breathed a deep sigh of relief at his departing.

Although Nationalists of all shades of radicalism have been aroused by Mr. Roosevelt's censure and many meetings have been called to protest against his strictures and the attitude of the British, the departure of the Roosevelt party was marked only by pleasant features.

The Nationalist press continue its denunciation of Mr. Roosevelt, expressing astonishment that the former chief executive of a republic should ally himself with a monarch and imperialist government.

Cairo, Egypt.—Two thousand ultra-Nationalists took possession of the thoroughfare overlooked by the windows of the Roosevelt apartment in Shepherd's hotel Tuesday and for half an hour deafening cries, uttered with fanatical intensity filled the air. This was in resentment of Col. Roosevelt's self-introduction into Egyptian affairs and was expressed by a mob scene in the principal streets of Cairo.

"Down with Ibars!" shouted the mob. "Long live liberty! Long live Egypt! We demand a constitution! Long live independence!"

The mob finally marched down the street, wheeled and returned to repeat the demonstration, with its ranks augmented by Cairo ragmuffins, then departed to disperse.

Col. Roosevelt was visibly agitated when he returned to his apartments and learned of the significant demonstration.

## 16 NEW GRAFT INDICTMENTS

### Grand Jury at Pittsburg Return Bills Against Councilmen—Head of Health Board Caught.

Pittsburg, Pa.—The grand jury which has been investigating the councilmanic graft cases threw another broadside into the ranks of the "system" Wednesday by handing down 16 more indictments against councilmen who are alleged to have sold their votes for money. Five of those indicted are members of the present city council.

The sensation of this lot of indictments, however, was the introduction of the name of Dr. E. P. Walters, now head of the department of health and charities and leading man in the cabinet of Mayor Magee. The grand jury, in indicting Walters, insists it has proof that while he was president of Pittsburg councils, he solicited and accepted a bribe of \$1,000 for his vote in councilmen.

Sixteen members of the office force of the Farmers' Deposit National bank appeared before the jury, under the escort of detectives, and were put through a warm session of quizzing before they were dismissed.

Capt. Johnny Klein, former common councilman, whose confession of graft "pulled out the props and let the sky fall" in the present graft crusade, was taken to the Western penitentiary to begin serving his three and one-half years' sentence.

### Crumpacker is Renominated.

Lafayette, Ind.—Edgar Dean Crumpacker was renominated for member of congress from the Tenth Indiana district at the Republican convention held here. The names of Taft, Beveridge and Crumpacker were loudly cheered.

### Two Die in Fire.

Youngstown, O.—Two men were burned to death in East Youngstown Tuesday in a fire which destroyed three homes. John Tracy and Henry Blaine were cremated. Patrick Carney, his wife and four children were rescued.

### State Is for Income Tax.

Jackson, Miss.—The Mississippi legislature Tuesday adopted a resolution favoring the income-tax amendment to the constitution of the United States.

### Slays Man Found in His Home.

Chicago.—Enraged on returning home unexpectedly and finding a man in his house Monday, Sortineto Cirilla, 227 West Twenty-fourth street, drew a revolver and shot the visitor four times, killing him instantly.

### Picks New Italian Cabinet.

Rome.—Luigi Lazzarini, minister of agriculture in the cabinet which resigned March 31, practically has decided upon the new ministry, the formation of which was entrusted to him by King Victor Emmanuel.

## JUSTICE BREWER FALLS DEAD

### MEMBER OF SUPREME COURT EXPIRES SUDDENLY IN HOME.

#### Hard Work on Big Trust Cases May Have Brought on Attack of Apoplexy.

Washington.—At 11 o'clock Monday night Associate Justice David Josiah Brewer of the United States supreme court was discovered dying in a room at his home in this city and before a physician could reach him he was dead of apoplexy.

Justice Brewer was one of the best known members of the supreme bench to the people of the country. He was one of the most outspoken in public speeches and interviews, and though a Republican, never let his partisanship interfere with the criticism of Republican administrations.

Close application to the work of the supreme court in the Standard Oil and tobacco cases undoubtedly hastened the death of the associate justice. He had been devoting himself ever since the recent arguments to the study of the Oil trust cases and he had a volume of the record of the case in his hand when death overtook him.

He had gone into the bathroom to prepare his bath after having devoted the night to study. A few minutes later Mrs. Brewer, second wife of the justice, heard him feebly calling for aid. When she reached him he had become unconscious. He died before Dr. H. A. Taylor arrived.

Justice Brewer had been in his usual good health all day and had taken his accustomed walk.

District Judge Ashley W. Gould was summoned immediately by the family, and took charge of affairs in the stricken household.

Miss Minnie Brewer, who lives in Washington, an aged sister of the justice, is in such feeble health that she was not notified.

## HUNDREDS KILLED IN FIRE

### Ball in Hungary is Turned into Scene of Horror—Roof Falls on Dancers.

Mate-Szalka, Hungary.—Two hundred and fifty people were killed and many others were injured in the village of Oekoerte Sunday when fire broke out in a hotel at which a ball was being held.

A coach house connected with the hotel had been fitted up as a ballroom, and was crowded with several hundred guests when the fire started. It was noticed first when a woman's dress was seen to be ablaze, and a moment later the gowns of several women were in flames.

A panic following, and in a mad rush to the exits persons fell and were trodden to death by others.

The roof fell before the hall could be cleared and many injured persons and those who because of the crush at the doors had been prevented from escaping were buried with the dead in the ruins.

### Tries to Burn Sick Wife.

Mahamoy City, Pa.—Samuel Reed, 50 years old, a contract stone mason, poured a gallon of kerosene on his invalid wife and then set her oil-soaked clothing on fire. Attracted by the screams of the woman, neighbors rushed in and tore the flaming garments from her, but she was so severely burned she is not expected to survive. Reed was jailed.

### West in Grasp of Storm.

Denver, Col.—Winds of almost hurricane violence, accompanied by heavy rain and snow, nearly cut off this city from the outside world. Over the entire region west of Kansas City to the Pacific coast; from Santa Fe, N. M., into central Wyoming the storm raged, paralyzing telegraphic communication and seriously delaying railroad traffic.

### Pinchot is Mystery Abroad.

Cuxhaven, Germany.—Gifford Pinchot, said to have sailed on the steamer President Grant to meet Mr. Roosevelt in Europe, could not be found when the vessel docked Wednesday. The purser's private list does not show that he was aboard.

### Indicted for Killing Girl.

New York.—Albert W. Wolter was Wednesday indicted by the grand jury for killing 15-year-old Ruth Wheeler. Wolter probably will be placed on trial next Monday.

### Royal Stork Visits Sweden.

Stockholm, Sweden.—Crown Princess Gustave Adolph of Sweden, formerly Princess Margaret of Connaught, gave birth to a daughter Monday. The other children of the crown prince and princess are Prince Gustave Adolph, born in 1906, and Prince Sigvard, a year younger.

### Col. Levi C. Weir is Dead.

New York.—Col. Levi C. Weir, president of the Adams Express Company, died Monday at the Plaza hotel of heart disease, aged 64 years.

## EIGHT KILLED ON CRUISER

### Gun Explodes Aboard Flagship Charleston at Manila, While Vessel Was at Target Practice.

Manila, P. I.—A report that a fatal accident had occurred on the United States cruiser Charleston was confirmed Monday. Eight men were killed and several others were injured slightly.

While the crew was at practice at sea off Olongapo, the breechlock of a three-inch gun blew off, and in its flight across the deck cut through a steel stanchion and mowed down the men in its path. Seven of the victims were killed instantly and an eighth died from his injuries.

The dead: Anstedet, Walter, seaman; Barkman, Ralph, seaman; Barnerd, Maxie, seaman; Garden, Harry, seaman; Heater, Harry, seaman; McKee, Philip, master-at-arms; Mollin, Edward, private marine; Rummelle, Leo, seaman.

The cause of the explosion is not known. Rear Admiral John Hubbard, commander-in-chief of the Asiatic fleet, has ordered an investigation. The bodies of the victims will be buried at Cavite.

The Charleston, which is Rear Admiral Hubbard's flagship, Monday returned to the firing range. Her commanding officer is Commander John H. Gibbons.

## BANKER MARKER IS GUILTY

### Cashier of Tipton Bank, Charged with Embezzlement, Will be Sentenced This Week.

Indianapolis, Ind.—William H. Marker, former cashier of the First National bank of Tipton, Ind., was found guilty of embezzling \$100,000 of the funds of the bank by a jury in the United States district court.

Noah R. Marker, who was assistant cashier of the bank and was indicted jointly with his brother, will plead guilty, according to an announcement made by his attorneys.

Judge Anderson will sentence the brothers together during the week.

## MRS. LONGWORTH AN HEIR

### Daughter of Roosevelt to Share in Estate of Grandfather Valued at Millions.

Boston.—Mrs. Nicholas Longworth is a beneficiary in the will of her grandfather, George C. Lee, a wealthy banker of this city, who died recently. The will, which was filed for probate, directs that the income of half of the estate be divided among half a dozen relatives, of whom former President Roosevelt's eldest daughter is one.

## Quakes Terrorize Sicilians.

Rome.—A severe earthquake occurred in Calabria Wednesday and President of Calabria and Meleto. Inhabitants of both these towns fled to the surrounding country. Houses were shaken down in the second of the series of shocks extending over several minutes. Several other towns were affected, including Soriano, Gasperina, Monteleone, Montessoro and Borgia. Many of those shaken were among the sufferers in the quake of 1908, which destroyed Messina. The quake, coming while Mount Etna is in eruption, created a panic wherever it was felt. Thousands fled from their homes, prepared to camp out for an indefinite period.

## Alexander Agassiz is Dead.

Cambridge, Mass.—Alexander Agassiz, the eminent naturalist and president of the Calumet & Hecla Mining Company, died on the steamship Adriatic, Southampton for New York. The news came in a wireless message from Rodolphe Agassiz, his son, to Maj. Henry L. Higginson of Lee, Higginson & Co.

## Tom Johnson in London.

London.—Tom Johnson, former mayor of Cleveland, who arrived at Fishguard on the Mauretania Wednesday, is stopping with friends in Regents' park. He is visiting Europe with the hope of improving his health, which has recently been poor.

## Greek National Assembly Hears King.

Athens.—The proclamation invoking the national assembly was read by King George in the chamber Wednesday and was received with cheers. Queen Olga was present.

## Allids is Voted a Briber.

Albany, N. Y.—By a vote of 40 to 9, the senate Tuesday sustained the charge that Senator Allids had demanded and taken a bribe. The senate was unable to punish Allids, for before the vote began he resigned his seat and thereby released himself from the jurisdiction of that body. The question of what shall be done with Senator Conger, Allids' accuser, remains. A report that Conger intended to follow Allids' example and resign proved unfounded, and his action is in doubt.

# NEVER KNOW CAUSE

## Witnesses Fail to Agree on Exact Cause of Awful Wreck.

### MAY MAKE RECOMMENDATION

#### State Railroad Commission, After Hearing Testimony on Green Mountain Catastrophe, Say It Will Remain Mystery.

Des Moines, Apr. 1.—From the testimony adduced by the state railroad commission in its investigation of the causes of the Green Mountain wreck it will be impossible to ever ascertain the exact cause of the terrible catastrophe, according to the belief of the members of the commission who have returned from Marshalltown.

Commissioner Eaton stated that no two witnesses agreed as to the cause of the accident. Some said it was a broken rail, some blamed the condition of the roadbed some the speed of the train while running backwards, some said it was due to the spreading of the rails, but none agreed.

"The cause will never be known," said Commissioner Eaton. "We established the fact that the ill-fated train was running twenty-five miles per hour at the time of the accident. The commission will probably make some recommendation to the governor, though what we have not agreed."

Members of the commission refuse to give any expression of opinion. It is not believed that even in the final report to Governor Carroll that the commission will attempt to lay the blame for the accident. Members of the commission were highly eulogistic of John White, the dead pilot, for his efforts to get help to the wreck victims while he himself was fatally injured. The commission also highly complimented the people of Marshalltown for the manner in which they worked to relieve the sufferings of the wounded and to care for the dead.

## COAL MINES ARE NOW CLOSED

### Word Sent to Every Mine in Iowa to Close Down for an Indefinite Period.

Des Moines, Apr. 1.—Every coal mine in Iowa and the United States shut down at 12 o'clock last night for an indefinite period pending a settlement of the wage scale for the coming year, thus enforcing idleness upon 20,000 miners in the state and more than 300,000 in the United States.

Negotiations for a wage scale will be opened at a joint convention of the miners and operators to be held at the I. O. O. F. hall on Monday afternoon, April 11.

By the agreement reached at the joint convention the district union will supply all the men needed by the owners to protect their property from damage and to make necessary repairs and improvements.

## JUDGE PLATT ROUTS BURGLAR

### Drives the Intruder From the Room, Although the Latter, Had the "Drop" on Him.

Waterloo, Ia., Apr. 1.—Judge Franklin C. Platt of the district court had an exciting experience with burglars in his home. His wife was awakened by a man at the side of the bed. She warned her husband, who jumped up and drove the burglar out of the bedroom, though covered with a gun and warned on pain of death to return to bed. When the robber had been driven out of the room the judge asked his wife to get his revolver, but the robber and his pal escaped without any booty.

## Brakeman Probably Fatally Injured.

Council Bluffs, Ia., Apr. 1.—While attempting to board his train at Underwood, C. L. Thomas, a brakeman on the Milwaukee road, whose home is at Perry, Ia., fell and was probably fatally hurt. He was hit upon the head by some object. Thomas was hurried to Council Bluffs and placed in a hospital.

## \$1,000,000 Willed to Woman Worker.

Rochester, N. Y., Apr. 1.—Mrs. William Grandy of Wolcott, who was lately employed here, has learned that she has been left \$1,000,000 by an uncle, Daniel Boughton, a publisher of New York city, who died recently.

## Alleged Forger Caught.

Iowa City, Apr. 1.—C. B. Curran, indicted by the Johnson county grand jury during the winter for alleged forgery, has been discovered at Shenandoah and is under arrest there.

## Frost Severe But Fruit Unharmed.

Des Moines, Apr. 1.—Although the ground was made white with frost Thursday night the thermometer did not go below 35 degrees, and fruit dealers in the vicinity of Des Moines report their crops unharmed.

## Gilbert Grain Elevator Burns.

Boone, Ia., Apr. 1.—Word has been received in this city from Gilbert, that the big elevator there, had burned to the ground. It contained 8,000 bushels of wheat and the total loss will exceed \$15,000.

## Denies Buying Crooked Creek Road.

Boone, Ia., Apr. 1.—Homer Loring of Boston, president of the Fort Dodge, Des Moines & Southern interurban, is here and denies that his road has any intention of taking over the Crooked Creek railroad.

## Big Banquet Held.

Iowa City, Apr. 1.—The biggest university dinner in the history of the State University of Iowa was held here Wednesday night. More than 400 plates were laid. President MacLean was the toastmaster.

## IOWA HEALTH BOARD

Physicians of State Said to Favor Abolishing It.

### WANT STATE HEALTH OFFICER

Dr. Kime of Fort Dodge, Outlines Plan for a State Commissioner of Health, With Full Power to Act.

Fort Dodge, Apr. 1.—Dr. J. W. Kime of Fort Dodge while in Des Moines a few days ago, said that the doctors of the state, in their county associations, are now considering and individually have indicated favor for a plan to abolish the state board of health and to have appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate a commissioner of health with full power.

Dr. Kime said that the proposition would be put up to the state medical society which holds its meeting in Des Moines the middle of May and he was confident that the society would adopt it.

"We advocate the abolishment of the state board," said Dr. Kime, "and in this connection it is not unfair to claim that practically all of the doctors, and most of those on the state board itself agree with my statement, for the following reasons:

"First—it is now strictly a political organization and is not made up with a view to efficiency in matters of sanitation.

"Second—it has not the confidence and respect of the medical profession, of the people, or of the legislature. It is therefore without the efficiency it should have in matters pertaining to the health and life of the people.

"Third—the system is wrong and out of date. We should have a health commissioner, with full powers to act, in the health department instead of a secretary to the board who has no powers at all.

"Fourth—we advocate the Pennsylvania and New York state plans. These states have a commissioner of health and an advisory board. Both are appointed by the governor, but require the confirmation of the senate. This in a large measure takes it out of politics. The names of appointees lie over for a day or two for consideration upon the part of the senate.

"One of the members of the state board is now drafting a bill to this effect which the doctors of Iowa will ask the legislature to pass."

Asked and Given Plain Talk. Cedar Rapids.—General Manager Melcher of the Rock Island system, who visited here following the disaster in which fifty people lost their lives, at Green Mountain was told some plain truths by the railroad men whom he called into conference. Manager Melcher asked the trainmen to be frank with him, and they were. The men, who are old and experienced employees of the Rock Island system, told him that the company tracks are in bad condition and that the motive power is in even worse condition. While the Green Mountain wreck was not on Rock Island tracks, the trainmen made it a point to tell him some very plain facts in regard to the condition of the equipment. They also told him what they thought of running engines backward. The trainmen suggested to Manager Melcher the need of more attention to the proper maintenance of right-of-way and equipment and less to attempting to make a financial showing to please a few stockholders. It is said Melcher gave the company employees a very respectful hearing, and indicated that a movement to better conditions would be undertaken immediately.

Farmer Killed By Trolley Car. Waterloo.—G. W. Lehman, a farmer aged about 30, living eight miles northwest of here, was killed by an interurban car at the curve at Fossilman's siding. He was lying face down across the rail and the body was severed at the waist. He was in Waterloo and got off an interurban car half a mile from the point where killed.

Says Loose Rail Caused Wreck. Marshalltown.—C. M. Marshall, master of equipment for the Rock Island railway, declared at the state railroad commission's investigation of the Green Mountain wreck that the accident was caused by a loose rail, the end of which was struck by the wheel of the first engine's tender.

Well Known Dubuque Man Dies. Dubuque.—Nicholas Matthews, aged 50, died after a short illness. The deceased was a brother of Judge Matthews on the district bench and well known Dubuquer.

Files Suit for Slander. Nevada.—Claiming that he has been maliciously slandered by George Cole of Roland, Fred C. Rodgers, a canvasser, has filed a petition in the office of the clerk of the district court in which he asks damages in the sum of \$5,000.

Seniors Decide on Play. Iowa City.—The senior class of the University of Iowa has decided to present "A Midsummer Night's Dream" as the class play in June, during commencement week.

Resigns Railroad Position. Mason City.—G. R. Martin, for eighteen years district passenger agent for the Iowa Central road, has resigned and will go into business in Chicago. He is the son of the late Henry Martin, former general manager of the road.

Pottawattamie County Ditch Work. Avoca.—The big ditch that is being made to straighten the Nishnabotna river between Avoca and Carson is progressing rapidly, the crews working day and night.
