## Meet The Candidates For D.M. School Board

As an attempt to further acquaint the black community with the candidates for the Des Moines School Board, we sent a questionnaire with the following questions: (1) People from the north area are complaining that the plan to close Tech and move Tech to North has racial overtones because North is one of the best integrated high schools. How do you feel about the move of Tech to North? (2) How do you feel about involuntary/voluntary busing? (3)

How do you think the present desegregation plan is going and what changes, if any, would you want to see? and (4) Ways you feel you will be an asset to the Des Moines School Board.

The following are the candidates' responses:

**RON BEANE, 35, operations manager for the Iowa Commission on Aging.** In his answers, Mr. Beane stated (1) "I think we all need to look at other cost saving choices before we allow the North High attendance area to be taken away. The staffs at North and Tech have

taken me completely through their buildings and discussed what the proposed change will mean to the students. The Superintendent's plans will divide the present North attendance area among the other high schools in Des Moines. The administration assumes that the enrollment pattern for students in the area will not change even though North won't have an attendance area.

(2) From what I have observed, the voluntary transfer program has

been successful in providing options for the education of students. Many families are choosing on their own to have their children take advantage of the opportunities outside of their regular attendance area. This is benefitting the individual students who are choosing to transfer as well as the overall system by providing more even distribution of students throughout the district.

(3) The school desegregation plan has been working reasonably well. Many people who objected to matching

schools together have now found this to be an acceptable way to get a more even distribution of students. The school district is now gaining experience about what portions of the plan are working better than others. I would like to see a report from the school administration discussing those portions of the plan that are working the best and then utilize those aspects of the plan where feasible.

(4) Declining enrollment makes it more important than ever that we all work

together to ensure good education on a sound economic basis. My education in economics and my experience in management allow me to develop economical alternatives in the use of our tax funds. We should explore using our school buildings as community resources available for other activities when they are not needed for regular school activities. We need to explore all ideas before we make irreversible decisions about giving up some of

## Bankers Life Receives Employer Of Year Award

## Michael Reed Heads Civil Rights Program In Iowa

"It is of paramount importance that prison inmates make new friends, unlike those they had when they got in trouble," said Michael Reed, director of New Life Ministries.

Finding new social links for inmates nearing the end of their prison terms is a major objective of New Life Ministries, headquartered in the southwest Iowa town of Red Oak.

Reed, a former running back for the University of Northern Iowa in the late '60s, has returned to assume the executive directorship of New Life Ministries.

The program emphasizes contact between ex-offenders and members of the community and is considered a model in new approaches to reforming convicts,

Reed said. It is non-profit and non-denominational.

Most other prison reform programs, said Reed, emphasize either finding employment for inmates upon their release or on enriching the spiritual and social lives of the inmates while in prison.

New Life Ministries, on the other hand, deals with the "total person" by seeking employment of the ex-offender and providing new social contacts before and after release.

Michael Reed completed his bacheloret at Northern Iowa where he served as Black Student Union president and earned "All Conference" honors in football. In 1971, he began a teaching career in Kansas City where his duties included English,

Career Education and Social Studies in addition to Coaching responsibilities.

In 1975, Reed became the only black high school head football coach in the state of Kansas.

He received a Masters Degree in Educational Administration in 1975 at Kansas University and helped write a desegregation plan for the Kansas City schools.

With the help of his brother-in-law, Lucius Allen (professional basketball star of the Kansas City Kings), Reed founded Michael J. Reed Assoc. a business management firm that specializes in handling the financial management needs of professional athletes. Reed's office was in New York City until joining New Life Ministries.

The school board elections are just around the corner. There are so many candidates with so many different ideas that one needs a score card.

Some of them are running against anything they think people don't like, with no attempt to try to come up with counter suggestions. And I have noticed that only one candidate is opposed to school closing.

The big issue in this seems to be money and the people in the areas. In some areas with schools tagged for closing people have begun to move back into the area, and in at least one there is talk of a housing project.

We in Des Moines have been lucky so far. The few attempts to stir up race hatred to the point of violence didn't get off the ground as the sponsors wanted them to. Our school board for the most part discussed the issues in a calm manner and seemed to make the right decisions, even if they didn't please everybody. And there was no really concentrated effort to replace board members with one issue candidates.

It may be that a new board will give some of the plans set out by the present one a good look and may even reverse some of them. And I haven't heard any

people express an opinion about the ward system. So unless it sneaks up on us, it may be in trouble. Voters usually vote against something instead of for it.

Now, if the thing doesn't turn out to suit you, and you didn't vote, shut up. Take what comes and try it at the next election.

With all of the stuff and nonsense of the last few years, we are becoming a nation of cynics. Our President doesn't get off the air before commentators are disagreeing with him. Public opinion of just about all that is connected with Washington has reached a new low. So it is no wonder we greeted President Carter's tale of a swimming rabbit with "Oh, yeah".

But, do you know that I don't think there is a four legged animal on earth that can't swim. For instance, cats dislike water immensely, but they are good swimmers if they have to do it. I might qualify that by wondering if moles can swim, but I would have to bet they can if they got in the water.

But if getting that story believed was Carter's biggest worry, he would have it made. However, the tale of the swimming rabbit was a good relief story to ease some of the tensions of the many problems facing the President today.

### NIGERIA: AN AFRICAN STATE IN TRANSITION

Nigeria, a country with Black Africa's largest population (some 80 million) and most productive economy (with a 1978 gross national product of 33 billion dollars) has recently undergone and will soon undergo a number of political, social and economic changes which are worthy of comment here. Nigeria is a nation which has emerged rapidly as a leader of the "Third World" in recent years and, because of its reserves of easily refineable crude oil, it is likely to so remain for an indefinite period in the future.

But during the period of time since the overthrow in 1975 of the army officer who had ruled the country since the military took power in 1966, General Yakuba Gowon, and the present time, one of his successors, Lieutenant General Olusegun Obasanjo, has taken steps leading to the installation of a federal democratic political system similar to the one we have here. He has recently lifted the ban imposed by the military in 1966 against political activity, adopted a constitution quite similar to ours, and held an election to select Nigeria's first

popularly elected chief executive.

If all goes as planned, he will turn over the reins of leadership to a government lead by that newly elected President, Alhaji Shehu Shagari, on October first of this year. When that happens, Nigeria will have returned to the democratic system it inherited when it won its independence from Great Britain in 1960. To make sense from this uncommon trend of events, I think it is necessary that we have some idea of the heritage from which it has developed.

Although the two British protectorates of Northern and Southern Nigeria were officially joined in 1914, the governments of the two territories remained separate entities until 1946 when the first nationwide legislative council was established. This situation was due not only to cultural differences, but also to the wide variation in the degree of development of political institutions among the many ethnic groups in the country. There are over 200 ethnic groups in the country, each of which has its own language, customs and traditions; the larger groups are the Hausas (appx. 6 million), the Fulanis (appx. 5 million), the Yorubas (appx. 10 million) and the Ibos (appx. 7 million).

A further divisive factor in the social and political fabric of Nigeria is the religious diversity between and among these ethnic groups.

At the time of the 1963 census, nearly 47 percent of the people counted were Muslims and 35 percent professed to some form of Christianity. The greatest concentration of Muslims is in the Hausan northern part of the country, where nearly 72 percent of the population so worship. Conversely, in the primarily Yoruban west, Christians are somewhat more

numerous, and in the eastern part of the country, they make up some 77 percent of the total population. These and other factors which I will discuss later have combined to make Nigeria's social and political past a confused and unsettled one.

Under the civilian regime which ended with the military takeover in 1966, the federal government consisted of a Council of Ministers over which the Prime Minister presided, a Senate and a House of Representatives. Legislative powers were vested in the House and Senate, while executive powers were vested in the Council of Ministers. The titular head of state was the President, who held office during a term of five years, after which he was subject to re-election.

Each region (or state) had a constitution similar to the federal one; it provided for a governor, an Upper House (House of Chiefs) and a regional House of Assembly. At the local level, there was a considerable variation between the individual regions.

In the primarily Hausan Northern Region (which, during the colonial period, was ruled indirectly by native feudal overlords under British control), the state was divided into emirates, overseen by a kind of traditional ruler (the emir) who presided over the local council.

In the Western Region, where the Yoruba people had established centralized administration prior to the occupation by the British, each local government unit was ruled by an oba (a supreme chief) and his subordinate chiefs. In the Eastern Region, it was totally different.

Political 'flak' and uproar hardly settled over the Andrew Young — US State Department incident before a Russian jet liner was detained more than 70 hours in violation of international law. Our State Department was determined to rescue one ballerina in the presence of our busy defenders of human rights if only she would hint that she really didn't want to go home.

Before we could draw a breath of relief, we are told Russian combat troops are in Cuba — 2 or 3 thousand of them! According to Secretary Vance, State Department, many of these soldiers have been in Cuba for as long as ten years.

This bit of information sheds light on the following

speculation ... Senator Richard Stone (Florida) 90 miles from Cuba, a member of the Foreign Relations Committee is unsure about re-election next year. Russian troops in Cuba make a dramatic political platform when your rating is slipping! The opponents of SALT II have promptly thrown up one more roadblock by postponing public hearings that were to continue this week. To complete the bad news of the week, Pres. Carter has asked for 4 billion dollars more to add to the Pentagon budget of 130 billion!

Proposition No. 1 is the good news of the week. Women Strike for Peace and a large number of other peace groups are planning a mass demonstration at the White House Oct. 13, in the midst of hopefully, continuing SALT II debate, to deliver hundreds of thousands of signatures on petitions demanding an end to the arms race.

The petitions, called, "Proposition No. 1 — A People's Referendum For Survival" protests

President Carter's military priorities. Proposition No. 1 charges that "the highest military budget in U.S. history is a root cause of inflation by eating \$130 billion out of the American economy while producing nothing that the people can use".

Proposition No. 1 demands that Pres. Carter initiate a world summit meeting of chiefs of nuclear states to abolish nuclear "stockpiles which can destroy every city on earth seven times over".

These are some of the organizations sponsoring Proposition No. 1, Coalition For A New Foreign And Military Policy, Americans For SALT, U.S. Catholic Conference, the National Council of Churches, the Women's International League For Peace And Freedom (my organization).

These Proposition No. 1 petitions will be coming together from all over the country. I'm not sure of going to Washington, Oct. 13th but I expect to do my part for SALT II by making petitions available and collecting signatures. Do sign, please.

A Black Look  
At Politics

Black-on-black crime is a major problem in most Northern inner-city areas. It plagues ghetto businesses, and often forces them to move to more hospitable surroundings, usually located in predominately white neighborhoods. While almost all major types of crime (i.e. armed robbery, assault, rape, and burglary) are confined within racial or ethnic groups (white on white, or black on black), the crime problem in black neighborhoods raises serious questions of racial self-hatred.

What many people — especially whites — don't understand is that most every aspect of American life is negatively-oriented toward people of color. The English language itself is a good example of this; etymology, or the study of words and their use, demonstrates quite clearly the racist foundations of the English language, dating to thirteenth-century Protestant England.

We speak, therefore, of the "black devil", "black magic", "black lie" (always worse than a little

white lie), "black Sunday", the "Dark Ages", and so on. In America and Britain, there is a distinction of meaning based on color; black is associated with bad things, white with good things. For instance, we wear black to funerals and white to weddings, establishing a white / life, black / death dichotomy.

All of this relates to a profound sense of black self-hate in this country, which has existed since slaves were first brought to America in the early 1600's. Not even the "Black is Beautiful" movement of the sixties could totally overcome this deep-seated self-hate rooted in the black psyche, and the 1940's and 50's witnessed the ultimate in black degradation.

Hair straighteners, skin bleaches, nose shapers, and the like were all pitiful attempts by blacks to "look white". Then, as now, and for some 350 years, light skin has always been seen as an advantage to upwardly-bound Negroes who found more ready acceptance from whites than their darker skinned brethren. Skin color divided blacks socially for decades, and contributed to our political and economic weaknesses.

These facts point to an intense feeling of inferiority on the part of most black Americans, especially inner-city inhabitants, who suffer widespread degradation, humiliation, and brutality at the hands of white society. Even middle-class suburban blacks often feel contempt and embarrassment for the actions of their less-fortunate brothers, and berate them as severely as whites do.

Also, geographic proximity plays a decisive role in trying to explain black-on-black crime, for many blacks are still crowded together in run-down ghetto areas. We are more prone to attack those nearest us. Economic pressures play a part as well, and skyrocketing crime rates in Houston, New York, and Atlanta are indicative of this. Our current recession simply fuels the National crime rate, although much of this increase is in-house crime, between persons familiar to each other, often relatives or married couples. Increases in police patrol activities, or even more police officers, would do nothing to offset this type of crime, known as "bedroom crime".

Many people, especially Northern politicians, express a dire concern over the need for effective National gun control laws, to reduce crime, especially violent crime. Unfortunately, even if registration, or elimination, of firearms in the private sector, could be implemented (which it probably could not), this would not appreciably reduce the amount of violent crime in this country. As most men who have spent any time in prison know, home-made "zap guns" are easily constructed from available scrap materials.

Too, psychologists have demonstrated that the mere physical presence of any type of weapon, be it gun, knife, club, pipe or chain, provokes violent crime. Would we seek to regulate kitchen knives and bicycle chains? Similarly, what of rifles and shotguns, used by hunters and trap-shooters? These are easily "sawed-off" by anyone wishing a concealable weapon which is far more effective than any handgun. And what if police were summoned to an area by a false alert, only to be jumped, killed, and stripped of their weapons? It has happened.

The role of the police in a society such as ours is primarily reactive; that is, they can do little until after a crime has been committed. They do not really prevent crime, for the most part, because the police cannot be everywhere at all times.

One problem with police action is that most officers expect to arrest blacks for most types of crimes; that's why there are more blacks arrested and in prison than there should be, based on the percentage of blacks in the population of the United States.

Did you know darker-skinned black men are more likely to be convicted of criminal charges than their lighter-skinned brethren?

Did you know that the American judicial system gives lighter sentences to blacks who kill blacks than to blacks who kill whites or whites who kill whites, indirectly encouraging black self-genocide? Relatedly, most district attorneys and public prosecutors are more concerned with conviction rates and politics than justice, as are most chiefs of police. Criminological statistics will bear out all of my assertions.

To offset many of these developments, and to avert the type of police activity that has been compared to fascist oppression of minorities in Philadelphia, Houston, and Chicago, Des Moines blacks must get involved with the Police Department. Waterloo, Davenport, and Cedar Rapids could also benefit from a commission made up of black citizens who would meet and review police policies, and attitudes toward minorities, with law-enforcement officials.

Communication is necessary, lest street shoot-outs and "hits" replace rational discussion, as they did during the 1960's. Blacks must try to see the intense pressure most police officers are under, pressure which results in extremely high divorce and alcoholism rates among police across the country. Police officers must realize that black suspects are not guilty until proven innocent.

Police brutality is a problem in Des Moines, though less so than in Philadelphia or Houston. Most of us know of the infamous elevator in the DMPD building. More black police officers would help, but the crux of the problem lies in our outdated criminal justice system and overcrowded prisons. But nobody wants to spend the tax dollars to improve the system, do they?

## THOUGHTS AND COMMENTS

Because the sphere of influence of each individual chiefs rarely extended beyond the territory of his village, the region was divided into provinces, each of which had an elected Provincial Assembly, and presided over by a provincial commissioner appointed by the state government.

The 1946 constitution created a central legislative body for the entire country as well as a House of Assembly (regional) for each one of the three provinces, which was in line with the thinking of Nigerian politicians who became prominent after the Second World War. These individuals not only were seeking independence from the British but also a federal form of government with strong powers vested in the individual states.

But anyway, all these thoughts were running through my mind and I had no single focus. And then I was lying in my bunk listening to Great Country K.S.O. when the newscaster mentioned a poll that had been taken showing that President Carter would be defeated by Cowboy Ronald Regan.

I bolted up from my prone position and immediately jumped down to jot down notes. My mind was a beehive bustling with activity. The thoughts spurred by this revelation rocked my entire being. Had I not warned the Black Bloc in my last writing that failure to recognize Jimmy Carter as a good man, and apathy at the polls might lead to the ascension to the presidency by Cowboy Ronald Regan?

That his shootem' up bang bang politics would inevitable get us into another war in the middle-east, South Africa, or right in the streets of the USA.

We would do well to recall the words of Alfred the Great; "Power is never good unless he who has it is good." Americans of this period engulfed by self-serving individualism wouldn't know a good man if they stepped on one. What really frightens me is that Regan with his Nixonian attitude may like his contemporary Richard Milhous Nixon ride the crest of the current backlash into the White House.

With so many issues such as the Bakke, DeFunis, and Weber, affirmative action cases threatening the meager gains of the Black Movement we cannot afford a Cowboy Ronald Regan in the White House.

There is a conspiracy against president Carter. The average American ignorant of global economic

The 1951 federal constitution gave but limited power to the states. In 1954, as a result of mounting pressure from the states, residual powers formerly reserved for the federal government were transferred to the states. The constitutional modification in 1954 made the states (the existing three) individually responsible for direct taxation, secondary and primary school education, health and most aspects of economic development.

The federal government retained responsibility for defense, external (foreign) affairs, transportation systems, postal services, higher education, customs, excise taxes and banking. The federal government also retained the ability to assume various powers of the states in time of war or whenever any state

The vacancy in Senate District 31, which includes north-central Des Moines and Ankeny, came about with the resignation of Earl

Willits. Governor Robert Ray called a special election for November 6th.

Baughner promised to work full-time between now and election day on his meet-the-people effort. "I'm asking these folks to vote for me," he said, "and they should have a chance to chat with me first."

### THE HAVE NOT'S QUESTION THE HAVES

Recently, the Des Moines Branch NAACP held its annual Freedom Fund Banquet. Several Des Moines community residents would like to hear a reason for the high priced tickets.

Realizing that inflation has everybody in a jam and gasoline prices are making most of us think twice about driving, there still needs to be an explanation. Where do the proceeds from the banquet go — back into the community? Strange, there are still children going to school without adequate clothing and food. It's profound to think of the unemployed, who are unmistakably the **have nots**.

When a prominent figure such as Mayor Maynard Jackson comes to town, nobody sees him but the **haves**, because the **have nots** are busy trying to find jobs and feed hungry babies.

Jackson spoke of the high crime rate in Atlanta, but right here in Des Moines, due to mental and physical starvation of blacks we continue to rip off and knock off and condemn one another, instead of working together as a unified force.

Jackson reported that we — blacks — have fallen into a state of believing we are free and that the NAACP should be double committed to seeing that

threatened the continued existence of the federation. When Great Britain granted Nigeria its independence in 1960, the nation was little more than an unstable federation in which one state (the Northern Region) had a size and population greater than that of the other two combined. Long before 1960, there was a sustaining movement by minority groups within the federation for the creation of more states which they felt would be more sensitive to their individual needs. That possibility was provided for in the 1954 constitution, but none of the other states were willing to divide up its territory to make that a reality.

The creation of the Mid-Western state out of the Western territory in 1963 followed a major political crisis in that part of the country which caused the federal government to invoke the previously mentioned emergency powers. Not until May of 1967, shortly before the beginning of the Biafran secession, was the federal government (military in this instance) able to subdivide the earlier three states into the current twelve.

America follows it creed. Several prominent Des Moines citizens made up the Dais platform, we the **have nots** are looking to them who hold higher paying positions and have influence in our community for guidance and support. Several blacks have been turned away from jobs, that could have been granted by blacks who have positions of influence, because they don't speak, act and dress according to the status quo.

"We are not a race of beggars, we are a race of achievers," stated Mayor Jackson. But we have existing within our community, groups and clicks of blacks who wouldn't give a dime to support community programs for our black children. The **have nots** don't want hand outs, they seek opportunities, a chance to upgrade and uplift their mind, a chance to accomplish the goals and objectives in their life whether it be cooking, cleaning and or sewing. My father once told me that only the strong survive and that teachers should teach students that somebody has to clean and the job is not demeaning. In addition students should be taught to respect all level of profession.

Clearly the **have nots** were absent on August 25, 1979 because they could not afford the price. Disregarding those who chose to buy a new dress, or spent money on buying their families school clothing and supplies, most complaints were from folks who walked up to me and exclaimed in disgust that they could not attend because they **had not** the money nor the proper attire.

"Tell It, Together We Can Do It" was the overriding theme of this years banquet, Mayor Jackson stated that the over whelming challenge is to tell it, decide how to tell it and where to tell it, his answer was to tell it in the ballot box.

Together we can do it! Emphases should be placed

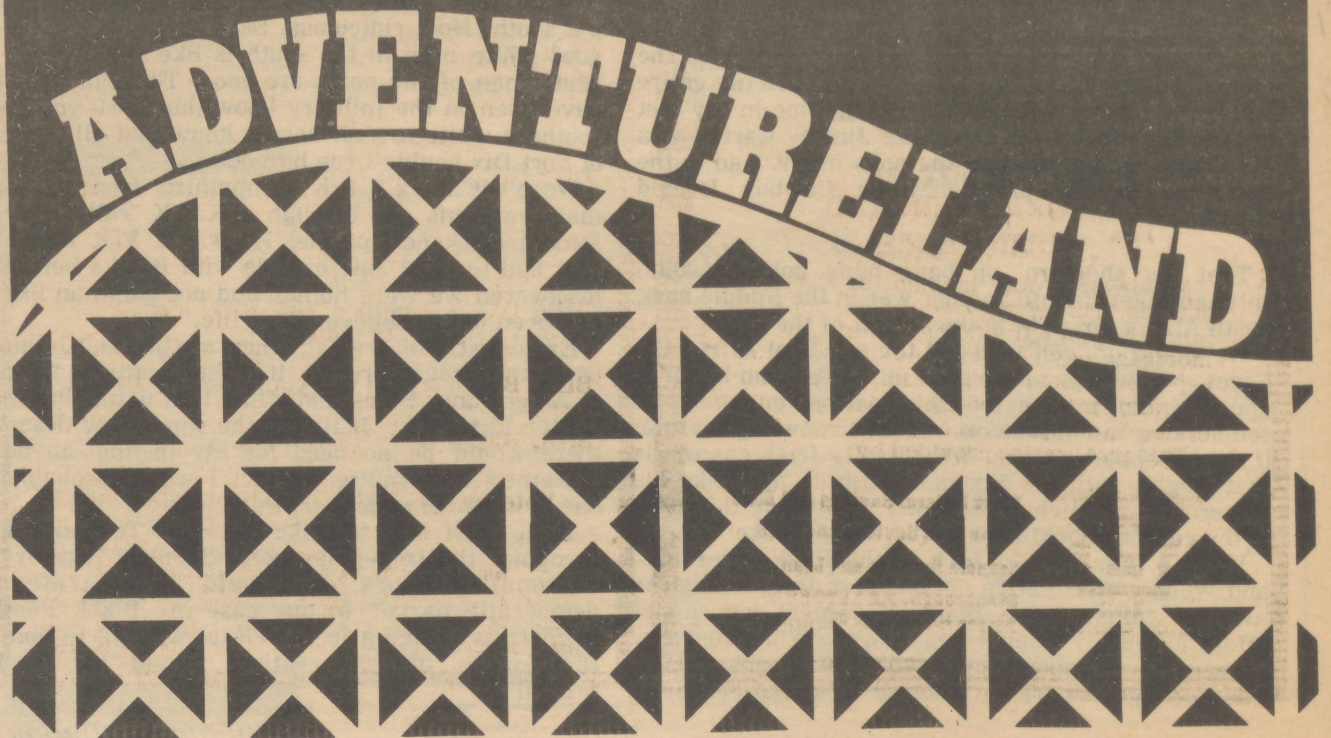

## Strokes and Folks

Are you ready for this? My husband and I were in Detroit two weekends ago to attend to sessions open to the public of the national convention of the Communist Party. We flew to Chicago and travelled by chartered bus to Detroit.

We had some second thoughts about the bus but plane fare has become so expensive, we decided to leave the driving to Trailway. We are glad because we would have missed the mixture of senior citizens, married and unmarried young couples and a few children.

The real treat was the singing of the Spanish speaking Puerto Rican and Mexican people. I began to feel that with a little more exposure, I would be able to speak the language. We, senior citizens were treated with much kindness and consideration.

I mention it because we discovered on our arrival in Detroit there was some confusion about reservations. We were feeling young and gay until the announcement about bedrolls and floor space. Both Doctor and I became over 65 instantly!

Fortunately our hotel reservation was still available.

The Saturday afternoon open session was limited to the presentation of official delegates from eight or ten of the nineteen delegates from as far away as Australia and Outer Mongolia (formerly Chinese). Perhaps it might have been more interesting to have heard their official reports to the convention. All were legally admitted into the country.

Sunday morning gave us our very first opportunity to hear Angela Davis. The occasion was a memorial service in honor of the late Rev. Charles A. Hill at Hartford Memorial Baptist Church. A chapel was dedicated to Rev. Hill at the service where a bust and portrait of Hill and Paul Robeson were unveiled.

Rev. Hill was honored for his dedicated services to the people for nearly forty years (1930-'68). He was a staunch supporter of the organizing drive to unionize Ford Rouge Plant in Detroit. This man is surely a part of American history and should be in every school book. Rev. Hill was a leading supporter of the union in the Black community.

He let union activists meet in his church, at a time when Henry Ford I ran Detroit and Dearborn. Rev. Hill understood Ford workers need for both a meeting place and the protection of the church from goons and spies.

Rev. Hill was one of the first Black candidates to run for City Council. Coleman Young, the current Mayor of Detroit, was Hill's campaign manager in the 1945 campaign. The Rev. Hill ran for Council several more times during the 1940s and 1950s and

served along with Coleman Young and others, as a state leader of the Progressive Party.

During the McCarthy era, when the House Un-American Activities Committee came to Detroit to hold its illegal trials of union and political activists, Rev. Hill was called to testify. Along with his defense attorney, George Crockett, Hill withstood the threats of the House Un-American Activities Committee and gained wide respect within the Black and progressive community.

The Hartford Memorial Baptist Church was the only public place which, during the McCarthyite hysteria, would provide space for meetings of progressive groups. Paul Robeson could hold concerts in Detroit.

Angela Davis is an excellent speaker. I felt I knew Rev. Hill, the kind of person he must have been when she told us about the courage of Rev. Hill in assisting the organizing drive at Ford Rouge Plant and swinging open the church doors for Paul Robeson during the McCarthy era. I remember how very hard those times were and how very frightened people were in those days without knowing why.

We were very proud of our opportunity to be a part of such a memorial service. Angela Davis was worth hearing and worth remembering.

If you're wondering where the glamorous portrait is, I went off for the Labor Day weekend and haven't claimed or paid for it. I've also had my hair cut while in Chicago two weeks ago, after the snapshot of my good side Crazy? Yeah, I know. Please do not spread the word. O.K.?

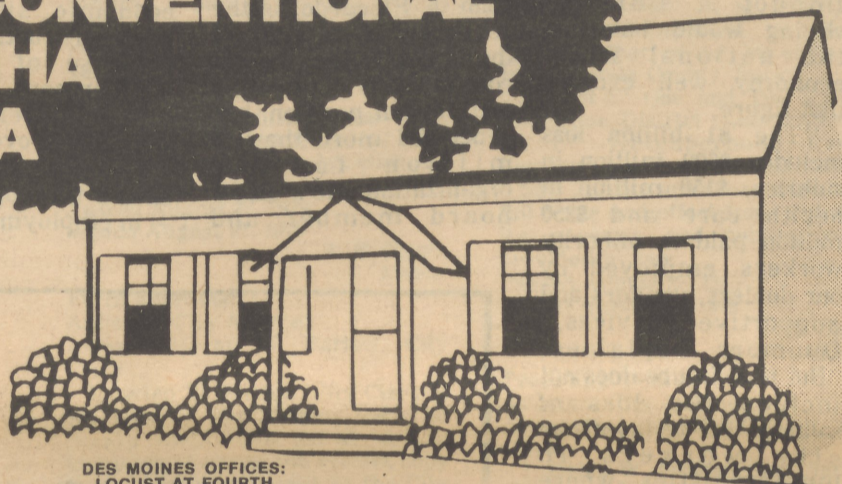

# Chrysler Corp Problems Affect Blacks

"You know, everytime this country gets a cold, Blacks get pneumonia."

That was a truism for Rev. Joseph Lowery, president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, while speaking about the ailing U.S. economy during a recent press conference in New York.

And that is the precise consequence facing Blacks if the financially troubled Chrysler Corporation is forced to close its doors.

A recent financial analysis of the corporation's financial position revealed that the loss in salaries and health care for its 35,000 Black workers would be a staggering \$1 billion. But, according to Albert J. Dunmore, Chrysler's director of Community Relations and Urban Affairs, the full financial impact a Chrysler closing would have on the national Black economy well exceeds that figure.

"The \$1 billion loss includes \$609 million in salaries, \$150 million in health care and \$250 million paid to minority workers employed by our dealers, vendors and supportive services," Dunmore explained. "But that figure does not include the loss of salaries due to layoffs of city workers in municipalities where Chrysler is located that would be necessitated by the loss of taxes the corporation pays."

"Last year Chrysler paid more than \$22 million in city, school and withheld employee income taxes to Detroit, \$4.5 million to Highland Park, and more than \$1 million to Wayne County. In each, a large number of Blacks are employed. So you see, this goes far beyond just Chrysler workers."

"The total impact on the state would include the loss of more than 75,000 employees, 34% of which are minority; more than 86,000 employees of suppliers, more than 6,000 dealership employees, \$2.4 billion in salary and fringes, \$94.6 million in corporate state and local taxes, \$89 million in employee state and local income tax withheld and \$3.3 billion in purchases from suppliers in Michigan."

Nationwide, he said, a Chrysler shutdown would cost the jobs of 544,000 employees, 28% percent of which are minority.

Mayor Coleman Young of Detroit warns of the domino impact in urging support for Chrysler.

In addition to the loss of jobs, Dunmore reminded, the national Black community would be impacted by the loss of Chrysler's leadership and support in the area

of social activism.

"Chrysler has taken a strong leadership position in the area of social awareness and responsibility," he pointed out. "It has gone above and beyond its responsibility in its participation in almost every major social effort."

"Included in our annual \$3 million in charitable contributions are the NAACP, SCLC, Urban League, United Negro College Fund and many others. We have been cited by the NAACP for being the first major automotive corporation to advertise widely in the Black Press, the first to use Black models and the first to establish a Black dealership."

In addition to financial involvement, there is also personal involvement by our top executives" he added. "Our board chairman, John J. Riccardo, is the corporate chairman of the Legal Defense Fund contributions campaign, and, in that position, has generated more than \$3 million for the organization. He's also a board member and

chairman of the Public Safety and Justice Committee of New Detroit, Inc."

Dunmore's participation in campaigns has generated thousands of dollars for a number of organizations.

Dunmore said that Chrysler's lead in supporting Black organizations has prompted involvement from other major corporations.

"Chrysler is the tenth largest industrial corporation in the country," he pointed out. "Naturally when we contribute a certain amount to an organization, the larger corporations top that amount. So even though our contributions are often exceeded by those from corporations with more money, it has been our initiative that has generated much more for Black causes."

Dunmore said the economic situation of Blacks is further periled because of the poor track record of foreign manufacturers — who would take over much of Chrysler's market should the company fail — in employing Blacks.

"Those who might get hired would be relegated to the lowest rung on the totem pole," he predicted. "Last year at Chrysler, the weighted average salary for Black hourly employees was \$17,500. The average for Black salaried employees was \$22,000 and, interestingly enough, some 4,000 of these earned in excess of \$22,000."

"In addition, for those that might be hired by foreign manufacturers, upward mobility on the job might be non-existent, whereas our company has shown a steady increase in the number of Blacks in upper classifications."

"Chrysler has made continuing efforts to provide opportunity for upward job mobility to minorities as is evident in its increasing percentage in the employment in managerial, professional, and skilled positions."

"Doug Fraser (UAW president) has said that his concern is not for Chrysler; it's for the people who will be affected," Dunmore added. "Well I think it is

obvious that it will be Blacks who will suffer the most."

Again quoting Mayor Young, Dunmore reminded, "it is not a Chrysler or Detroit problem, it is truly a national crises."

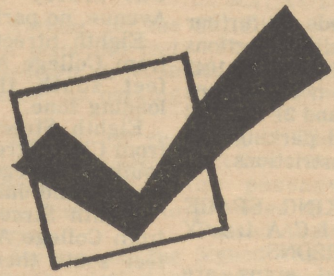

our valuable school buildings."

**SUE LUTHENS, 46, a homemaker and substitute teacher.**

"(1) The plan to close the present Technical High building and transfer its programs to the North High building is the best decision for the students and taxpayers. The administration and board have promised that a comprehensive curriculum will be retained in the North High building. I feel confident that the plan has no racial overtones. The facility will draw from all parts of the district.

"(2) Ideally, all participation in busing would be on a voluntary basis. I feel involuntary busing often lays the entire responsibility for racial integration on children. We need to strive harder for more stable and pervasive kinds of integration especially in housing and employment.

"(3) In general, the pairing of schools appears to be effective. It is a plan which the board must monitor closely as conditions change.

"(4) I have laid the foundation to become an effective and qualified board member. Two of my children have graduated and two are presently enrolled in the Des Moines schools. I have viewed the schools as a parent.

"I was a member of the '1976 Citizens Committee for Declining Enrollment' and as a result realize the hard work and frustrations of being a board member. I have been a substitute teacher and recognize the strengths and weaknesses which exist in our classrooms. I have a sincere concern for young people and their educational needs."

**WILLIAM R. BECK, 36, an accounting analyst for Iowa Power and Light Co.**

"(1) Projected figures indicate that the minority enrollment following the proposed Tech/North move will not greatly effect the racial balance. I am in favor of the move primarily because it would provide better facilities for the vocational education students and wider curriculum choices for all students.

"(2) Voluntary busing as a part of the current desegregation plan seems to be having a positive effect. This plan should constantly be reviewed so that we may continue to offer a choice and not be forced by government mandate to require involuntary busing.

"(3) Pairing of schools is just one of five plans that are currently in use

to meet Civil Rights rulings. The desegregation program has helped to improve the quality of education in the Des Moines schools. Much effort has been made to maintain the quality of education in the Des Moines schools. Much effort has been made to maintain the quality of programs to meet the needs of our youth. Integration is a long range goal, which will be achieved through various procedures which should be continually evaluated to check their effectiveness while providing the best educational programs for our children.

"(4) I am a concerned parent, who wants quality education for all children. I am an active parent with experience as school volunteer; have held PTA offices, attend school meetings and various workshops, active in the Boy Scouts program.

"I would be serving to meet the needs of the entire school district. I feel that I can listen to the people of the community and seek their opinions. I have made a commitment, if elected, to devote the time needed to meet the needs of the child."

**RALPH CHILDERS, 35, a vocational rehabilitation trainer for the Iowa Department of Public Instruction.**

"(1) I am opposed to the move of the Tech program to North for economic reasons. I do not believe the move has racial overtones. Currently, North has approximately 19% minority enrollment and Tech has 30%. The combination would provide a minority enrollment of about 26%. Tech has a good facility now. With some equipment updating it would continue to be an excellent facility for a long time. The move would be disruptive and extremely costly.

"There are many alternatives in the use of the North building that ought to be considered; for example, placing the traditional school in the North building would allow an old building to close and allow the Traditional School to expand if there is sufficient interest among parents and students.

"(2) I believe all children benefit from meeting and associating with a variety of people. Since such a large part of a child's life is spent in education, the experiences that happen there are extremely important. Due to continuing housing patterns, busing is a necessity if we are ever going to break down patterns of segregation and provide equal opportunity for everyone. Voluntary busing is to be preferred, but I would not back

away from the use of involuntary busing if it was needed to accomplish the goals of our desegregation program.

"(3) Matching schools has been a good way of getting a good mix of students. My daughter is a voluntary transfer student at Edmunds. However, we must be careful to get multi-cultural and non-sexist instruction from teachers committed to this approach and provide instructional materials that also support this approach. Students together is better than segregation; but if the instruction does not change, things will not be as good as we can make them.

"(4) I do not have a commitment to keep any school open. I feel that I can look objectively and with reason at the hard problems and decisions that must be made. With limited funds and falling enrollment, we ran a great risk of letting emotion and thinly veiled racism control our decisions. I would work hard to see that reason instead of emotion was in control."

**PAUL G. LAY, 34, Social Security disability examiner.**

"(1) I oppose the Tech/North move. If a high school has to be closed, Hoover would probably be best choice. Prior to Closing Hoover I would favor experimenting with keeping it open on a partial tuition funding basis. Parents in the area would have the option of paying tuition for their children to go to a neighborhood school. Of course they wouldn't be forced to send their children to Hoover.

"(2) I support voluntary busing. The present plan is not totally voluntary because there aren't enough volunteers. A system of penalties and incentives could be used to encourage more volunteers. Parents who are lukewarm toward busing should decide how much of a monetary penalty they would be willing to pay to avoid the inconvenience and how much of a tax rebate they would require to encourage them to volunteer.

"(3) Wherever possible we should avoid using coercion to force the implementation of social improvement programs such as integration. People are more likely to support integration if they are given a choice.

"(4) I support increased voluntary funding as an alternative to taxation. This would give us more flexibility and more independence from state and federal interference in our local schools. Voluntary funding would give people financial as well

as electoral control over the schools to make them more responsive to community needs. Parents who can afford to should be willing to take more of the burden for their children's education. I would even support educational work release programs so the children could pay at least a nominal amount toward the costs of their own education."

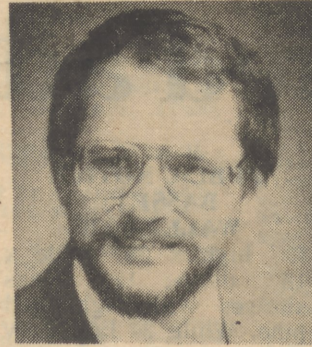
**KAREN WILLIAMS, 34, a homemaker and present member of School Board.**

Her replies were "(1) I tentatively would approve of this move. The Board instructed the Administration to provide the community the cost details and the reasoning which led it to suggest the Tech to North move. Until all materials are in, I would reserve the opportunity to make the final decision. I think there are some legitimate questions still being asked about the real cost on the move and the building.

"I think there are some potentially very fine things that could occur for North High students and Tech students with this merger. With the core areas in the technical program and the core area in the academic program, this would indeed be a unique option for the students in the immediate area and the students across the district. Again, I would stress that this still is in the preliminary stages and there are questions that yet need to be answered.

"(2) Voluntary busing indicates the ability of choice that is optimal over involuntary busing. What is most important is what occurs at the end of the ride. The district is serving voluntary transfer students better today than when the program was first begun. There are now some unique support systems which help children adjust to the change.

"(3) The plan is working well for the students who are now

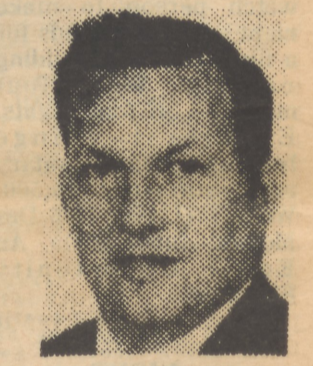

# LOOK ON SPORTS



The other day we received a communication from a disgruntled would be entrant in the Hilltop Closed tennis meet, with a special copy addressed to Chet Williamson. I always figure that anybody who has been around tennis as long as I have should be immune to any sort of criticism, and I am. However, the letter to Williamson sounded to him like a personal attack, and he said it was so far out and full of inaccuracies that he wouldn't dignify it with a reaction.

But I always make a policy to reply to any sort of criticism if the writer signs his name, so since this one was signed, I shall deal with it.

In your opening statement, you said the Hilltop Closed meet was reserved for blacks only.

That is wrong as two left feet. The tournament is reserved for people who play regularly at Good Park

and they happen to be ninety percent black. Sooner or later some white player is going to fill the requirement and become eligible for the meet.

Do you think we spent twenty years trying to break down lily white tennis around the state to close our ranks in that manner? We were holding Hilltop tennis tournaments when your parents were either very young or had not been born yet. These things started in 1929, and have continued without a break since then, becoming integrated in 1949.

Prior to that year they were all black because we couldn't get into very many of the meets around the state. You further stated that the draw this year was less than half the 1978 number. Wrong again. In 1978 we had twenty one singles entries, and this year we had seventeen. Did they all have ESP or did they know something the rest of you didn't know?

We haven't been advertising our meet too much because we didn't want to be besieged by people from all over town wanting in, black or white when they didn't play at Good. One fellow said he could play there a couple of times and enter, but he was informed that it was also invitational, and we didn't invite people we didn't want.

Granting that our method of spreading the news about the meet isn't exactly a Madison Avenue one, I am sure you can see why it isn't. I received telephone calls about the Hilltop Closed as early as June, and I was able to give them the starting date. I don't know how many of those callers entered, since I didn't ask their names. But I don't believe

that any one of the seventeen players who played in the thing will say it was not well run and finished in seven days in spite of work schedules.

The entry lists in the meet last year seemed larger because the players played when they wanted to and dragged the meet out over a two weeks period.

Now, did you try to contact any of the "organizers" as you call em, and try to work out a time when you could play before the meet had actually begun? If I wanted in the meet, that is what I would have done. You made a trip to Chet Williamson's house about the Hilltop Open; what prevented you from doing the same thing about the closed?

It looks as if you made the mistake so many people make when they get upset about something. You unloaded your thoughts before you got them organized, typical of so many young people. And it wouldn't help you or anybody else to ask for special treatment in that meet or any other that we are connected with.

We figured the Hilltop Closed would give just the people you described a chance to have some fun and competition among themselves. But the people have to realize that they have to adjust their hours to the meet, and not the meet to their hours.

The excuse, "I have to work" isn't valid. So do just about all the other tennis players who get into tennis meets around here have to work. I hope that maybe next year you will get in the thing, and maybe your one men's opinion might be a little different.

environment and opportunity.

(4) The board needs new members and some members with experience. I have now served one term (3 years) and feel that I have gained much knowledge that only experience can give. I've served as vice president and am currently president of the Board. The second reason is that I am trained as an educator, (four years of classroom teaching and B.A. and M.A. in the field of education;) third, I am a parent of 4 children (3 in elementary and 1 pre-schooler).

"I believe very strongly in benefits of public education for our City and Country's future citizens. Public schools have the responsibility to educate each and every student to the best of his or her potential. Each student is unique and has unique learning patterns and learning rates. This needs to be recognized and dealt with so that each and every student leaves the school doors prepared to survive and excel in today's world."

**HARRY WAGNER, JR., 49, a building specialist for Northwestern Bell Telephone Co.**

"(1) A Tribune Poll said this was supported by a majority of the school district. I also support the move to preserve North High and the community it serves.

"(2) I support the voluntary busing program of the Traditional School which had a waiting list of over 500 students. This program last year had test results in basic skills in the top 25% in national norms! It had 25.7% minority enrollment.

"(3) I do not believe the "magnet concept" is a good basic skills

program so I don't feel the students will be elevated to the educational level that they should attain by being in this program. I would expand the Traditional School to two more schools; and

"(4) I would emphasize the basic skills for all students to help those that are having problems in these areas. The competitive job market of today demands students that have attained a high level of basic skills. I also do very thorough evaluations of test results and the budget to see where changes are needed."

**SALLY SMITH, 44, a former school attendance clerk and homemaker.**

"(1) Everyone in the north area does not agree that move has racial overtones; however, everyone does agree that North is a fine facility. Since Tech and North offer different types of education, the merger would offer an innovative curriculum that all Des Moines could enjoy.

"(2) All busing is too expensive; but no one has come up with a reasonable alternative. I think we need to look at other options. I respect the sight of those who elect voluntary transfer, but its still expensive.

"(3) It is a credit to the people of the Des Moines school system that it has gone so smoothly when many people were unhappy about it. At this point, I'd make no changes.

"(4) I'd be an asset to the board for several reasons. The strongest being that I have been attending board meetings and workshops on a regular basis for 5 years. I feel I have a working knowledge of board procedures and have struggled through the problems of desegregation and

declining enrollment right along with the Board.

"I believe this is a critical time for the Board and anyone newly elected must have knowledge of past action taken by the Board. This experience combined with the fact that I am a widow, on a fixed income makes me think I can add a new dimension to the board."

**JAMES D UNDERWOOD, 40, executive director of Iowa Comprehensive Manpower Services, Inc.**

"(1) If there are racial overtones to the School Board's plan to move Tech to North, I am not aware of what they are, nor can I see reasons for concern on anyone's part. The Board must remain alert to head off any problems of segregation before they occur, including this proposed move or any others.

"I favor the proposed move and believe that it is one of the most positive actions the Board has taken recently. There are many reasons why I think it is a worthwhile plan, including the ultimate savings in operational costs, the fact that it should provide new and needed emphasis on and updating of vocational education programs and the plus that North High and its academic program can be retained, since there is a demonstrated need for each.

"(2) Any voluntary program is probably better than an involuntary one, whether it is busing or anything else. The sad fact is that voluntary programs don't always work, or achieve the necessary goals. In the case of a workable and acceptable desegregation plan, involuntary busing is a component, but it must not be one where only

minority students are bused.

"(3) From all indications, Des Moines' desegregation plan is working better than anyone, including the initial opponents, thought it would. At this point I see no need for any changes. It is vital that it be assessed and evaluated on a continuing basis so as to assure its goals are being accomplished, and high educational standards are maintained.

"(4) My professional background and work with employment programs for low income and minority youth have given me a particular understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of our educational system, which I think uniquely qualifies me to serve on the Des Moines School Board. I believe that I could represent all of the citizens of Des Moines and I am not running for

office because of a single issue, such as a threatened school closing in my neighborhood.

"When I ran for the School Board last year, I learned a great deal, received the endorsement of many groups and individuals, and more than 6,000 votes. Many of the people who supported me then encouraged me to try again this year and the response to my candidacy has been very positive thus far. I would like to serve the Des Moines School Board and feel that I would be an asset to our school's growing body."

As of press release, we had received no response from Gloria Richardson, 33, a former day care center worker; and William McCarthy, 31, a Des Moines police sergeant.

We urge the black community to go to the polls and be counted not only in the upcoming

School Board election Tuesday, September 11, but also in the upcoming Municipal election, Tuesday, November 6, in which we will be electing a Mayor and three Councilmen — not to mention the upcoming 1980 Presidential election.

Get involved — to be a voter you must — be a U.S. citizen, 18 years of age or older and be registered in Polk County. Register anytime in person 10 days prior to election date or by mail, postmarked 25 days prior to election date, signed by a registered voter. Various forms of transportation are provided.

The black community must recognize the importance of maximum registration and of an informed electorate, and we must all work toward achieving these goals.
