C. T. Vivian — America Must Deal With Issue Of Color

In a stirring speech, C.T. Vivian, a former colleague of Martin Luther King, told a crowd of 80 people last week at Simpson College that the very survival of America rests on how it deals with "the issue of color."

Author, activist and minister Vivian was in Indianola Oct. 16 to receive the Seventh Annual George Washington Carver Distinguished African-American Achievement

Award for outstanding contributions to human and race relations.

In accepting the award, Vivian remembered Carver as a "great black thinker, a doer." Carver once attended Simpson and later obtained a degree from Iowa State University in Ames, where he also was an instructor. He then journeyed south to Tuskegee Institute in Alabama, where the scientist invented over

2,000 uses for the peanut and the sweet potato. By doing so, "he saved the agriculture of the South," Vivian said.

He was a man who "didn't place a price tag on life," said Vivian.

In his dramatic, 90-minute appeal, Vivian said "as we get closer to the end of the century, more and more the issue for the very survival of America is the matter of color."

"The world is basically crumbling

around black America. Affirmative action has in fact, not worked," Vivian said, saying that a strategy for change must be developed in the 1980s where men and women of conscience and goodwill generate progress by disturbing the conscience of America.

"I'm talking about the freedom of America," Vivian said. "Everything is falling down in America, for America has learned it cannot

shoot away anything it doesn't like." He gave examples of the American Indian, Vietnamese, and black Americans, in reference to the resurgence of the Ku Klux Klan.

Making frequent reference to Martin Luther King, Vivian said, "America dropped little crumbs off the table not because we demanded economic change; we were given the right to vote not because we demanded

political change, but because Martin King put the conscience of America on the hook — and America squirmed under the spiritual rage and might that reached for conscience, not for crumbs."

Vivian said "America is scared" and the reaction to what America has perceived as a deterioration in its world power has been to

Elections October 25 For Neighborhood Priority Boards

Less than three weeks remain before the November 4 Election Day, but there are 137 residents of Des Moines who are hoping that public interest in national and state politics won't overshadow their own campaigns for public office.

They are running for seats on the City's Neighborhood Priority Boards and have begun their own grassroots campaigns, distributing hand-bills, talking with neighbors, encouraging elderly residents to vote by absentee ballot and appearing at local candidate rallies.

At stake are 127 seats on the Neighborhood Boards in the City's 6 Prime Service Areas.

neighborhood board means an opportunity to influence the way the City spends its federal HUD Community Development and Community Services Administration funds.

These federal allocations are targeted toward solving problems that affect low income neighborhoods—crime, deteriorated housing, economic growth, employment—but cities have a broad latitude in how they spend their allocations.

That's where the neighborhood boards fit in. They have, recently for example, sought and received City Council approval for expanded police security and crime prevention from two prime service areas to all six of the areas, a

new scattered site housing Rehab program in the Four-Mile area and funds for relocation efforts on the City's South-east side.

The boards also received approval for planning funds for Rehab/Redevelopment of a portion of the Model City area. Over the past nine years, over 90% of the boards recommendations have been approved by the City Council—accounting for almost \$40 million spent in those neighborhoods during that period.

Election day for the six Des Moines neighborhoods is Saturday, October 25, 1980. Polls open at 9 am and close at 7 pm.

Voters need not be registered to vote but must sign a registration card indicating their address in the precinct in which they are voting. Persons 16 years of age and older can vote.

On Wednesday and Thursday, November 12th and 13th, the Willkie House is offering two seminars on rape prevention and self-defense.

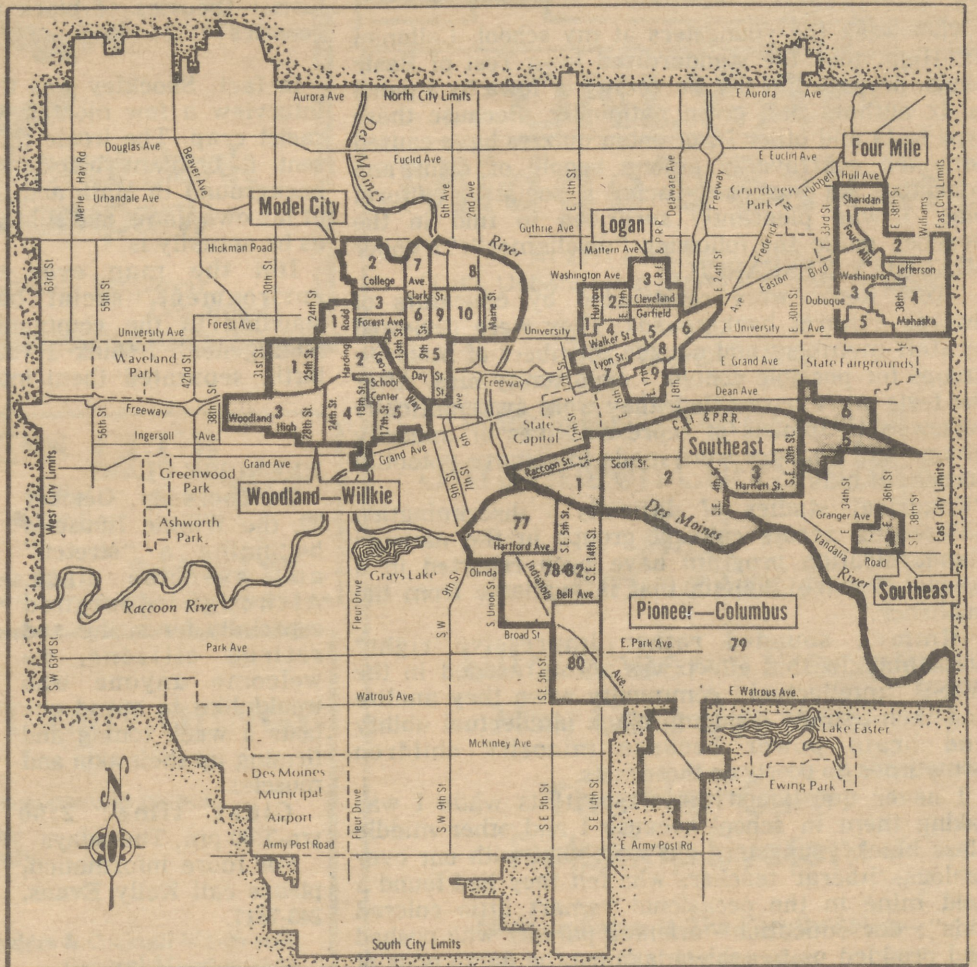
Bev Jorner, Counselor, Polk County Rape and Sexual Assault Center and Linda Moore, Polk County Deputy Sheriff

From some of the people who are interested I got a report on the progress of the new Good Park swimming pool. Chet Williamson said it was shorter and narrower than the old pool, and he also said that there would be no deck to watch tennis matches from.

So I went to see for myself, and it simply reinforces what I have been saying for years. If the people who built the first Good Park pool knew what they were doing, we never would have gotten that setup, one of the best in the state for viewing tennis matches.

And this time they do know what they are doing, and we won't get that setup or anything like it. Builders may talk about money and space all they want to, but one fellow had it pegged well when he said that the new pool would not come close to standard measurements for meets, so there would never be a swimming meet in that pool.

Also there will never be people watching from the deck to see tennis matches. So as long as that place exists, it will just be too small to have anything worthwhile there.

I can recall our own swimming meets that often had more than five hundred spectators and at least a couple of times around a thousand, and not one line would get into the daily press. Folks who ran the meets said that our results were not wanted in the paper, and they may have been right.

When we first began to have swimming meets at Good, we drew people from all over, Kansas City, Chicago, Milwaukee, Omaha, and some of the strongest white swimming clubs in the state. The meet got so big that it was suggested that it be moved out to Birdland, and there it remains to this day under another name, but the same meet that was started at Good Park.

So the pool was closed and is being replaced by another one, and this time people are going to make sure that they won't have any competition from Good Park. Black attendance at the pool has dropped off because people of all races can swim in their neighborhood pools and do. But people are moving back into the area and there will soon be a whole new bunch of kids for the pool.

A shame it will be so small that there won't be any worthwhile programs there.

When you think that the pool was a place where people from all over the city met and where mothers could nearly always find their children because there were so many programs for them. People like Frank Robinson, Vern Ashford, Cecil Brewton, Joe Howard, Leo Simms, and Elbert Webb taught maybe a thousand kids to swim over the years.

A stranger who comes to the new pool won't see very much to brag about, but if the stranger had been around the place in the thirties through the seventies, and had looked in on our Hilltop Tennis finals, once the Hawkeye finals were held there and the place got raves about how good it was. Well, that won't happen again.

"The Case of Archie Webb v. I.W. Griffith A piece of Iowa History"

I was doing some research at the Cowles Library at Drake University the other day when I came across an interesting article about a black resident of Iowa during the Civil War who won his freedom in the courts of this state at a time when most white Iowans openly favored the institution of slavery. The Archie Webb case was brought to my attention in the booklet titled "Studies in Iowa History: The Negro in Iowa" by Leola Nelson Bergman, and was explained in detail by a 1913 article in the Annals of Iowa (Third Series) written by Nathan E. Coffin.

Because of my interest in the Black history of Iowa and to give you some background of the history of our people who migrated here and settled in the middle of the last century, I will provide you with as much information about it as I can.

During early 1863, Webb was doing his usual chores on a farm owned by Stephen Brooks located in the Delaware Township area in Polk County. He

had been a resident of Iowa for less than two years, having previously been a slave on plantations in Arkansas and Mississippi.

A group of white men appeared and served upon him the following document dated January 8, 1863:

To Harcha Webb:

You are hereby notified and required to leave Delaware Township, Polk county, Iowa, in three days from the service of this notice or we will commence proceedings against you to compel your removal.

When Archie Webb refused to leave the state, he was promptly arrested by the Polk County sheriff, I.W. Griffith, upon the order of arrest issued by the township Justice of the Peace, Stephen Harvey. Following his arrest, Webb was taken before the same Justice of the Peace on January 20, 1863, tried (?), and fined the sum of twelve dollars and costs of two dollars and ninety cents and sent to jail until he could pay it or consent to leave the state.

A Petition for a Writ of Habeas Corpus was soon filed and an order issued to the sheriff to bring him before Judge John Henry Gray of the Fifth Judicial District of Iowa (which to this day includes Polk County) to inquire into the legality of his imprisonment.

At trial it was agreed that plaintiff was a free black, born in the United States, and that he came from the state of Arkansas to Iowa since the passage of the law of 1851 excluding free blacks from it. This statute, enacted by the Third General Assembly of

the State of Iowa, held in January of 1851, was entitled "An Act to prohibit the Immigration of Free Negroes into this State" and approved February 5, 1851. It may be summarized as follows:

"The first section thereof excludes free negroes and mulattoes, from and after the passage of this act, from settling in this State. The second section makes it 'the duty of all township and county officers to notify all free negroes who may immigrate to this State, to leave the same within three days from the time of notice, and upon their failure so to do it shall be the duty of the constable of the proper township, sheriff of the county, marshal or other police officer of the town, to arrest such free negro and take him or her before a justice of the peace or county judge, and it shall be the duty of such justice or judge to fine such free negro the sum of two dollars for each day he may remain in the State after such notice, and costs of such prosecution, and to commit such free negro to the jail of the county or to the nearest one thereto, until such fine and costs are paid, or until he will consent to leave the State; provided that it shall be ascertained that he or she is unable to pay such fine and costs.'

The third section provides that 'all free negroes now living in this State who have complied with the laws now in force, shall be permitted to remain,' etc. The fourth section provides 'that on the trial of any such free negro under this act, the justice or judge shall determine from and irrespective of his person, whether the person on trial comes under the denomination of free negro and mulatto.'

A Female Focus On The Issues

This week the youngsters at my school, Callanan Jr. High, took the standardized Iowa Test of Basic Skills, prepared at the University of Iowa by a panel of 12 authors and given nationally. Because these type tests and other IQ oriented quizzes have caused so much controversy among people of color and educators for supposed racial / social / cultural bias, I was pleasantly surprised to find in the Teacher guide the following "disclaimer" (?) under MINORITY RESEARCH —

"Test items were constructed by educators of diverse cultural backgrounds. They were reviewed by staff members and outside members of minority groups for possible content - opportunity bias. After the tests were assembled, they were systematically reviewed by panels of representatives of minority groups and changes were made to remove potential sources of bias.

"Empirical studies of difficulty - discrimination differences across cultural groups in the national standardization program have been reported in a Special Service Bulletin that is available from the publisher."

Hmm... sounded rather impressive right? Something to this effect was sorely needed in the WASP "intellectual" community when they analyze and then usually condemn black intellectual ability and brain power because minority children sometimes do poorly on these tests.

I never questioned these type tests while I was taking them in school because I and other middle class black youngsters did well what with our over zealous, 'liberal' teachers who felt they had found a gold mine in the occasional "smart little colored kids"; our education - oriented parents who pushed and prodded us to achieve against the harsh odds of racism and last sometimes over exposure to white

institutions — museums, art galleries, films, etc.

The thousands of black kids who could not cope with biased tests were not my worry until this form of discrimination was lambasted in the black power / pride era of the 60's. It so enraged me to have so called scientists such as Arthur Jensen and William Shockley representing such acclaimed institutions as Harvard and Stanford Universities espousing their fascist theories of black mental inferiority due to genetics????!!

In fact, Shockley was the subject of the Playboy Interview a few months back talking the same old racist crap. The ironic thing was that Hugh Hefner sent a brilliant black interviewer with a strong background in Math and science who beat Shockley at his own game and subtly made him look as foolish as he actually is.

Did the man ever take into consideration environment, social background or economic standing in the community as a determinant of intelligence? I think if you took two black twins at birth, separated them into different households —

one, an upper middle class, highly literate, very verbal family with educational and social "advantages", caring, bright parents and a healthy stress on achievement and self worth — the other child going into either a ghetto situation or a sharecroppers family, say, with six or seven children, poverty stricken, little educational or health benefits — according to Shockley and Jensen the IQ test scores taken on these twins at age 12 would probably both be the same — low!

Such ludicrous reasoning doesn't even take into consideration that proper nutrition — prenatal and during early childhood affects IQ. Keep in mind that until recently, IQ tests did not measure native brightness, just how deeply a child was into the dominant WASP culture and how verbal he was.

Also in the past, some of the questions asked children of color in these tests have had about as much relevance to their lives as asking a Jewish child about chitlins.

Hopefully in the future educational "experts" will devise tests that will not stigmatize students but help them in their learning situations.



 At the hearing before Judge Gray on January 21, 1863, a number of parties appeared. The sheriff appeared in person and by his attorney J.S. Polk. Webb was obviously present, and represented by his attorney, Stephen Sibley, who had represented him at trial and filed for the hearing.
 The questions raised at this hearing pertain to the validity of the above summarized statute, and I will speak about that in upcoming articles.

FALL FROLIC TO OPEN AT BOTANICAL CENTER

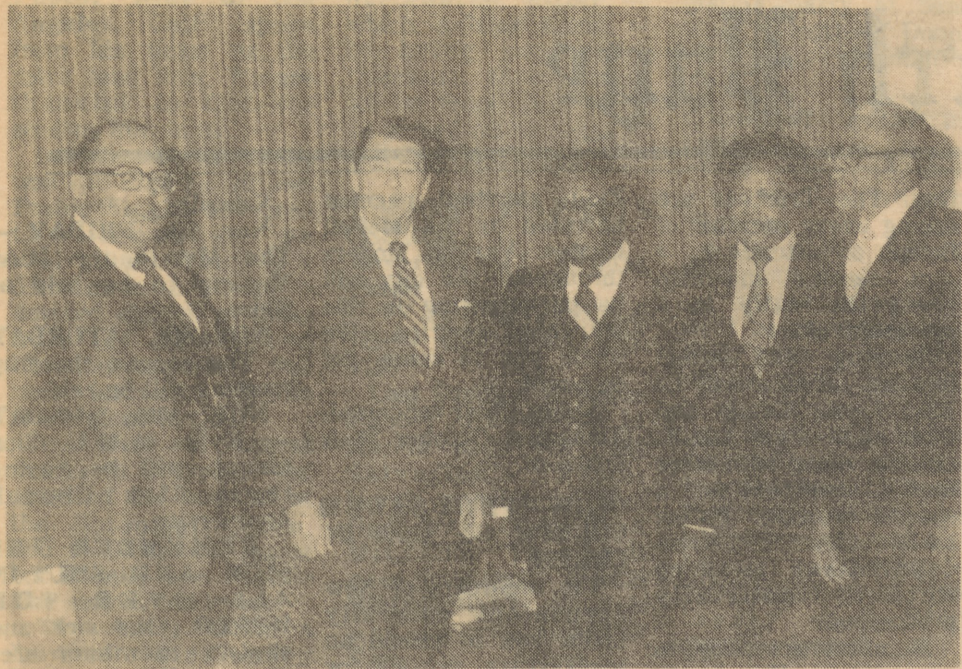

embrace "the politics of religion and the politics of violence." Christianity has been used, misused, and abused by the "evangelists of the right" who manipulate religion to veil their politics and "pass it off as democracy," said Vivian.

His fervent speech, interrupted frequently by applause, resembled a sermon, as Vivian gestured emotionally to the audience to underscore his message.

He spoke of the conservative and reactionary group that has become known as the "Moral Majority" and has in its arsenal 150 radio stations, 200 television stations and one group that has a newsletter that reaches 5 million people in 23 countries. He said the group is spreading confusion to cover for its real motives by saying if people are against Moral Majority, then they are against God.

"How human are you, America?" implored Vivian.

"It is a time to act in the spirit of a George Washington Carver and a Martin Luther King and face that which is inhuman in American with a humanity that speaks so greatly that the conscience of America will be affected," he said.

"We see the suffering around us, and inside we suffer. But we have not moved on the outside," noted Vivian. "Do we not care?"

Cordey Tindell Vivian is head of the Black Action Strategies and Information Center (BASIC) in Atlanta, Ga. He is known for creating the Urban Potential program which is a

traveling sensitivity workshop to combat discrimination in the workplace and society in general. Vivian has brought his workshop to Des Moines, Waterloo and Cedar Rapids in the past.

Vivian was in the forefront of the civil rights struggles in the 1950s and 1960s, and was beaten, kicked and hosed.

He is author of several novels, an ordained Baptist minister — which was evident in his inspirational speech — and editor of the Nashville Star.

Asian students get 'credit' test

A testing program initiated this year by the Des Moines Public Schools is helping Southeast Asian refugee students earn credits toward their high school diplomas.

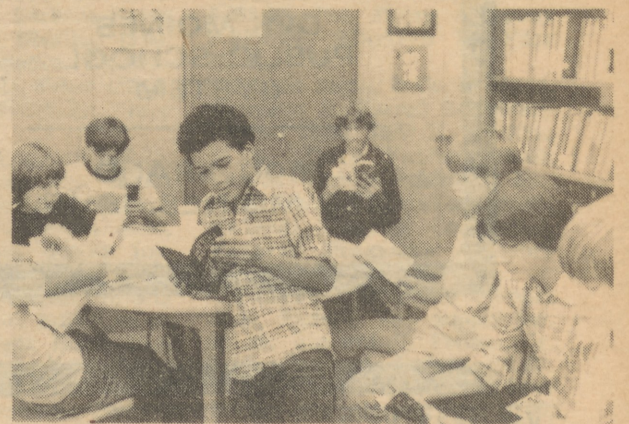
Tests in mathematics, science and French are available to students who have attended high schools in their native countries, but cannot prove it because their official school records have been lost. Bilingual interpreters are provided to assist the students with English language difficulties.

Ambrose Moses, director for Southeast Asian education, said Southeast Asian refugee students began enrolling in the Des Moines schools five years ago, at the rate of about 150 students a year. He said more than 1,000 are enrolled this year.

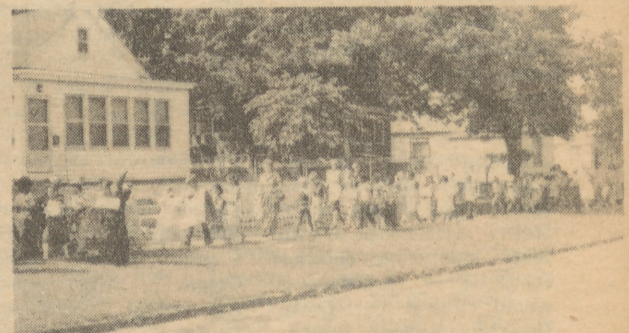
Before the testing program was developed, students had to repeat the high school requirements for a degree because of their lack of school records. This resulted in some 17-year-olds being enrolled in 9th grade classes, Moses said. Another problem was students who have missed school because of the wars in their countries and spending time in refugee camps. As a result, he said, the students first must learn English and then move on to study other subjects.

Moses said the testing program helps to give students a good start, rather than holding them back. In addition, he said it "helps the principals and counselors tremendously by giving them something to go by in placing these kids."

Big start for reading

Tackle tough problems with aid of computer

Math departments in the Des Moines junior and senior high schools have been increasing the use of computers in their programs over the past two years, said Wilson Goodwin, supervisor of mathematics.

Nineteen Apple II micro-computers are being used in all the high schools, and Callanan, Goodrell, Hiatt and McCombs junior high schools.

"In the past, we were limited to what we could do by tedious hand computations," said Goodwin. "The computer allows us to approach very difficult problems by speeding up the basic computational process."

Junior high students who have completed their regular course work are taught to work with the computers. Eleventh and twelfth grade, upper level math classes use them with problems requiring logarithms, graph functions and exponents. School administrators use them for manage-

ment purposes.

Goodwin said inservice training was provided to teachers with no computer background, but added that students are "less scared and learn quicker than the teachers." He predicted that computers "will become an integral part of the classroom."

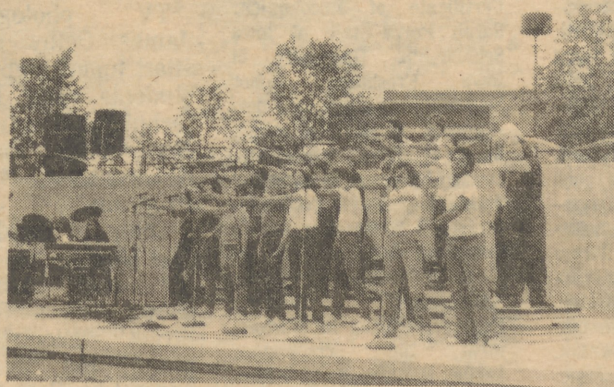
The micro-computers cost between \$2,000 and \$4,000, depending on their power, said Goodwin. This year, he added, money was provided to each of the high schools to help purchase a computer. Other funds are raised through various sources, including the help of PTA groups and student councils.

"The use of computers can help broaden and deepen the knowledge in a given study area," said Goodwin. "They can give students with the ability to handle them a background that used to be available only to students majoring in the subject at college."

Schools reduce energy use by more than 23 per cent

The Des Moines school district reduced energy consumption by more than 23 percent and reduced the amount of money spent for heating, cooling and cooking by nearly 10 percent last school year, according to a report prepared for the Des Moines School Board.

Victor Potter, director of plant and transportation, said the school district was able to reduce its use of energy by complying with the Emergency Building Temperature Restrictions issued by the federal government. The restrictions are scheduled to expire next Jan. 16. However, Potter said they are expected to be extended.

Under the energy conservation program, secondary school buildings, the central administrative office and some other school district buildings are heated only to 65 degrees during the heating season and cool-

ed only to 78 degrees during the cooling season. Elementary school buildings are heated to 68 degrees and cooled to 78 degrees, Potter said.

As a result, school officials urged parents to dress their children for the cooler classroom temperatures during the fall, winter and early next spring.

Potter said the 23.45 percent reduction in the amount of electricity, gas and oil used during the 1979-80 school year was a conservative figure. He said there were some other indications that the energy conservation may have been close to 30 percent.

The report said the 9.97 percent reduction in the amount of money spent for energy came during a period when the average unit cost of electricity rose more than 26 percent, fuel oil increased nearly 78 percent and the cost of natural gas was up more than 38.5 percent.

Adult education classes draw more than 41,000

More than 41,000 persons participated in programs sponsored by the Department of Community and Adult Education during 1979-1980.

The department's annual report showed 27,789 people were enrolled in all adult and community education classes during the fall, winter and spring terms—an increase over last year's enrollment of 26,255. The 18 program areas ranged from office skills and general business to English as a Second Language.

In addition, there were 1,435 participants in the World Travelers program, 2,043 in the Home Economics Outreach classes, and 4,649 Senior Citizen Outreach contacts, the

report said. The South Suburban YMCA programs drew 2,884 participants, Making Your Spare Time Worthwhile had 570, and 2,572 season and general admission tickets were sold for the Travel Adventure Series.

In the school district's Americanization Program, 51 people were enrolled in citizenship classes and 46 of those were naturalized. The same program sponsored English as a Second Language courses for 672 people, representing 19 different countries. The largest representations were from Laos (391), Viet Nam (152), Korea (31), Cambodia (26), Mexico (12) and Thailand (12).

The report stated that 772 instructors taught 1,225 classes in 62 school buildings, as well as in some churches, libraries and retirement homes.

Drug abuse programs in place at 18 schools

Eighteen schools in the Des Moines school district are working this year with the National Council on Alcoholism to develop individualized drug abuse programs in their school communities.

The schools are participating in the district's Substance Abuse Education Prevention Project, established in the summer of 1978. According to an evaluation report, the program grew out of "local community concerns regarding the use of drugs, smoking, and drinking among school-age children both in and out of school."

The program is a three-year plan, in which the NCA works with different schools each year. It was initiated during the 1978-79 school year, and by the end of this year will have been implemented in all Des Moines district schools.

The program is based on "reducing substance abuse by making people aware of the consequences and the alternatives," said Dorla Johnson, elementary consultant for Des Moines Public Schools.

"They learn there are alternative ways to feeling 'high' such as going to a basketball game with friends or listening to music," she added.

Following a preliminary "needs assessment", the NCA aids each building in establishing a program to fit its own needs.

As part of the program, the NCA trains teachers during the year. Johnson said teachers are taught to "assess their own values and develop an awareness to the needs of themselves and other people."

"The emphasis is on prevention," she added. "The program isn't a curriculum teachers can take into the classroom. They are trained from a humanistic approach, where they identify student behavior and try to understand what is causing it."

One of the aspects of the training is to increase teachers' sensitivity to their students' problems. Teachers learn to encourage students to seek help when necessary and to help them develop decision-making abilities.

The program includes a teacher workshop at the beginning of the school year. Staff members from each school plan and implement a program designed for their building. Two representatives attend 10 meetings during the year with members from other participating schools to discuss ideas and learn new information.

One example of a school's plan includes teacher training the first year, parent participating the second year, and student involvement by the third year. Programs in the
