A Proclamation Observing Negro History Week

WHEREAS.....Negro Americans have, from the earliest days of the founding of our Nation, proved themselves to be loyal and devoted citizens and outstanding exponents of our American way of life, and,

WHEREAS.....Our Negro Americans have made significant and important contributions to our way of life in the field of sports, education, science, music and in all other fields of endeavor, and have enriched our way of life with these lasting contributions, and,

WHEREAS.....It is fitting that Americans of all races and creeds and from all walks of life should pause in their endeavors and give recognition to the Negro Americans for their devotion to our Democratic ideals and for the contributions which they have made to our society,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Ed Jochumsen, Mayor of the City of Waterloo, Iowa, do hereby proclaim the week of February 8th to 15th to be Negro History Week, in our city, and do hereby call upon our citizens to join in the observance of this week in every way possible, and to better acquaint themselves with the history and the many accomplishments of our Negro Americans.
