CANDIDATES FOR VICE PRESIDENT

RUPERT P. AMANN was born on December 27, 1931 in Boston, Massachusetts. He received a B.S. in Dairy Husbandry from the University of Maine and M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in Dairy Science from The Pennsylvania State University with specialization in reproductive physiology. After postdoctoral training at the Royal Veterinary and Agricultural College in Copenhagen, Denmark during 1962-1963, he returned to Penn State where he rose from the rank of Assistant Professor to Professor in 1972. Dr. Amann spent a sabbatical leave at the Animal Reproduction Laboratory, Colorado State University, in 1975-1976. Dr. Amann moved to Colorado State University in December 1979 to assume his present position as Professor in the Department of Physiology and Biophysics in the College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences where he teaches and conducts research on male reproductive physiology. He is a member of six professional organizations and has served as a director for both the Society for the Study of Reproduction and the American Society of Andrology. He is presently on the editorial boards of Biology of Reproduction and the Journal of Andrology. Dr. Amann has a broad background in andrology and has published numerous scientific papers on semen preservation, testicular and epididymal function, and male reproductive endocrinology. In 1979 he received the American Society of Animal Science Award in Animal Physiology and Endocrinology for his research on male reproduction.

ANDRZEJ BARTKE was born on May 23, 1939 in Krakow, Poland and is now a U. S. Citizen. He received his Magister (equivalent to M.S.) from Jagiellonian University in Krakow in 1962 in Biology and his Ph.D. in Zoology from Kansas University at Lawrence in 1965. He then served as a Visiting Scientist at the Institute for Cancer Research in Philadelphia (1965) before returning to Jagiellonian University as an Assistant Professor of genetics that year. In 1967 he returned to the United States as a Fellow in Reproductive Physiology at the Worcester Foundation where he remained as a Staff Scientist (1969-1972) and then a Senior Scientist (1972-1978). In 1978 Dr. Bartke moved to the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio as an Associate Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology. From 1972 to 1977, he held a Research Career Development Award from NICHD. He served as a member of the Reproductive Biology Study Section at NICHD (1977-1981). He has taught in Kuwait and has served as an external examiner for Ph.D. dissertations at the University of Calcutta and Cairo University. He is a member of nine professional societies and has held office in the Society for the Study of Reproduction. He has been an active participant in ASA since 1976. He has served ASA as a member of the Council (1976-1978) and Chairman of the Membership Committee (1975-1978), as well as being Editor of the Journal of Andrology. He is interested in pituitary regulation of male reproductive function, especially the role of prolactin in maintaining steroidogenesis and in target organ responsiveness to steroids. He has numerous scientific publications in this area of reproductive endocrinology.

In 1979 he left to assume the position of Professor and Chairman of the Department of Biochemistry at Albany Medical College of Union University. He holds membership in six scientific associations, which include the Society for the Study of Reproduction, the Endocrine Society, and the American Society of Biological Chemists. He has served or is on the Editorial Boards of Endocrinology, Molecular and Cellular Endocrinology, and Biology of Reproduction. He has served on the Medical Advisory Board and the Subcommittee on Glycoprotein Hormones of the National Pituitary Agency (1968- ), on the Reproductive Biology Study Section (1971-1975), and is a consultant for the World Health Organization (1973- ). He has served as reviewer for the National Science Foundation (1975-1981) and the Ford Foundation (1974) and as ad hoc consultant to the Population Research Committee and Reproductive Biology Study Section of NIH (1977-1981). He holds membership in six scientific associations, which include the American Society of Cell Biology, the American Society for Developmental Biology, and the Society for the Study of Reproduction. Dr. Bellvé frequently reviews manuscripts for journals, including Biology of Reproduction, Journal of Cell Biology, Developmental Biology, and Journal of Reproduction and Fertility. Dr. Bellvé's research interests are in the molecular biology of mammalian spermatogenesis. He has published many articles on this subject.

FERNAND LABRIE was born on June 28, 1937 in Quebec. He studied at Laval University where he received his B.A. (1957), M.D. (1962), and Ph.D. (1967). He was an intern at L'Enfant-Jesus Hospital and a resident at L'Hôtel-Dieu de Quebec. In 1966 he was appointed Assistant Professor in the Department of Physiology at Laval University before going to Cambridge for postdoctoral studies in biochemistry and molecular biology. In 1969 Dr. Labrie returned to Laval University as Associate Professor. In 1974 he became Professor and currently serves as Director of the Research Center in Molecular Endocrinology at Laval University. He has received numerous honors, including membership in the Canadian Academy of Science and, most recently, he has been appointed Officer of the Order of Canada. He holds membership in 35 professional associations, which include the Endocrine Society, the American Society of Biological Chemists, the American Society of Cell Biology, the American Fertility Society, and the Society for the Study of Reproduction. In 1980 he received the Research Award of the Society for the Study of Reproduction and the award of the Fondation de Recherche en Hormonologie from Paris.
