Field Trips

Sunday, May 21, Birding Hike and Brunch- Springbrook

John Flicker named President of National Audubon Society

On April 14, the Executive Committee unanimously elected John Flicker to succeed Peter Berle as the next President and C.E.O. of the National Audubon Society. John Flicker is currently Florida State Director of The Nature Conservancy (TNC). He was born in Minnesota, where he was raised on a farm. Flicker served as TNC's Great Plains Director, where he initiated new State programs in Kansas, Nebraska, South Dakota and North Dakota. He oversaw the acquisition of 65,000 acres of private lands which became Conservancy preserves along the Missouri, Niobrara and Platte Rivers.

Flicker served as Chief Legal Counsel for The Nature Conservancy and later became Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer supervising 1000 employees and helping to manage a budget of \$75 million. As Florida State Director Flicker supervised over \$1.9 billion of new appropriations for land acquisition from Florida's Preservation 2000 and County Bond Campaigns. John Flicker will begin as Audubon President on July 1, 1995.
