

DeSoto Bend Area Field Trip - Nov. 17 & 18

On Sat. Nov. 17 we will meet at Wilson Island State Park at 1:30 PM to begin our birding. The entrance to the park is found by heading West on U.S. 30 from Missouri Valley, IA to County Rd. L-16. Head South on L-16 until you come to a "T". Then head West to the park entrance. Inside the entrance about 1/8 of a mile there is an information board where we will meet.

At 5:30 PM we will meet at Dehler Brothers Restaurant in Blair, Nebraska for dinner. The restaurant is on U.S. 30 near the intersection with Hwy. 133.

Camping for Sat. night is available at Wilson Island State Park. The park is adjacent to DeSoto Refuge where we will bird on Sun. morning. It is \$6 per night to camp and water is available but the building with showers and flush toilets will be closed. The closest motel to DeSoto Refuge is the Rath Traveler's Inn off of U.S. 30 near its junction with I-29. Their phone # is 712-642-2723 and you will need to make your own reservation if you wish to stay there. There are other motels just east of Missouri Valley.

On Sun. Nov. 18 the DeSoto Refuge opens their gate at 8 AM. We will meet at the Refuge Headquarter's Parking Area at 8 AM. We will then proceed to the Observation Tower for birding. The auto tour route beyond the Observation Tower will be closed. There is a \$2 charge per car beyond the Headquarters, so we will take as few cars as possible inside. We will spend the morning birding at DeSoto (hopefully finding large numbers of geese, and other waterfowl) and will have time to see the Visitor Center exhibits.


