#### **Audubon Adventures Program**

This year our society has provided twelve 4th through 6th grade classrooms in Story County with the Audubon Adventures learning series. Students in each selected classroom receive a monthly subscription to the series on our environment. Teachers of these classrooms receive a special teacher's packet each month to guide students and to provide supplemental material. Our Society pays \$30 per classroom subscription, and we are seeking donations of any amount to help pay for this learning tool. #### **Field Trip Reports**

On March 27, seven students of the introductory birder's class taught by Mike Meetz and other BBAS members joined seven Audubon members for a birding expedition to Hendrickson Marsh. Other stops included Ketelsen Marsh and a Nevada cemetery. Heavy fog impeded visibility but the group managed to see 42 species, including all three species of mergansers, ringneck duck, bufflehead, canvasback, northern pintail, northern shoveler, scaup sp., common snipe, brown creeper, white-throated sparrow, tree sparrow, and song sparrow.

The April 17 field trip began at Hallett's Quarry. It continued with a walk through Tieg's Marsh in far north Story County (the place the group got lost last year), and then finished at Little Wall Lake.

#### **Story County Pheasants Forever**

Pheasants Forever has in place a number of cost share programs for landowners. They are available for woody vegetation, for native grasses, and for corn food plots. Cost shares of up to 90 % are available for windbreaks. On Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres, 40 % of the cost of native grass seed established will be paid by Pheasants Forever (50 % from ASCS). On other acres, 50 % of the cost of native grass seed will be paid by Pheasants Forever. They have free seed corn for anyone interested in putting in a food plot. The food plots can be put on annual set-aside within regulations of ASCS. Also, they will pay cooperators \$20/acre for food plots placed on CRP land, up to 5 acres per farm unit. #### Audubon Regional Conference

Manhattan, Kansas will be the site of the West Central Region's biennial conference. The dates are June 10-13. Field trips are planned for Thursday and Sunday to: Cheyenne Bottoms and Quivira National Wildlife Refuge, to the University of Kansas' Museum of Natural History, to Chase County and Flint Hills sites. Friday and Saturday will include a variety of workshops and seminars. On Friday evening a picnic is planned on an 8600 acre, tall grass prairie preserve maintained as a research site by Kansas State University.
