#### Audubon Adventures needs sponsors

This year our Chapter has made a commitment to provide a subscription to Audubon Adventures for 10 classrooms in Ames and greater Story county. Audubon Adventures, the youth education program of the National Audubon Society, is for grades 3-6. Developed and written by professional educators with a special interest in environmental education, the series is issued on a bimonthly basis and the subscription period coincides with the school year. An enrolled class receives the Audubon Adventures newspaper for children (up to 32 copies per subscription), the Leader's Guide of background information and activity ideas for teachers, and student membership cards. Examples of subjects covered include: Wetlands, Animals that use Cavities, The Nesting Season, Nature's Harvest, and Tropical Rainforests.

We are looking for individual and organizational sponsors to help fund this worthwhile project of the Audubon Society. We have many teachers in the Ames area who would like to have a subscription to <u>Audubon Adventures</u> for their class but our current financial resources are not adequate to meet the demand. Our Chapter meeting on Sept. 20, 7:30 PM, 181 Design Bldg., will look at Recycling with state and local perspectives. Here are some statistics from the Environmental Defense Fund on waste generated in the U.S. to get you primed for the meeting:

\*American consumers and industry throw away enough aluminum to rebuild our entire commercial airfleet every three months

\*Every week, more than 500,000 trees are used to produce the two-thirds of newspapers that are never recycled

\*We throw away enough glass bottles and jars to fill the 1,350 foot twin towers of New York's World Trade Center every two weeks

\*We throw away enough office and writing paper annually to build a wall twelve feet high stretching from Los Angeles to New York City

\*We throw away enough iron and steel to continuously supply all the nation's automakers

Come to the meeting to learn more about recycling in Ames and Iowa and what you can do. Bring your comments, concerns, and questions.
