Monthly Meeting-

A Naturalist's Tour of Nebraska, by Ty Smedes, Nature Photographer Thursday, September 15, 7:30 PM, Room 2532, Veterinary Medicine Building, I.S.U., Ames.

Ty Smedes is an accomplished nature photographer who has had his images published in more than a dozen magazines and has led photographic tours around the country. He is from Urbandale, Iowa, and will be leading tours this year to Michigan's Upper Peninsula and to Yellowstone and Teton National Parks. His program on September 15 will be focusing on birding highlights of Nebraska such as Sandhill cranes, shorebirds, and Prairie Chickens, plus a colorful display of prairie wildflowers.

Field Trips-

Saturday, September 10, 10 AM -Noon- Wildflower Photography with Carl Kurtz The Iowa Chapter of the Nature Conservancy is offering this opportunity to learn about creative nature photography and prairie restoration from Iowa's renowned photographer, Carl Kurtz. The trip will take place at the Kurtz's Marshall County farm near St. Anthony. From St. Anthony go west one mile on County E 23, and then turn right on Binford Ave. (gravel road) and then go north 1/8 of a mile to 1562 Binford. Turn right and follow the lane to their house, which may not be visible from the road. Wear appropriate clothing for hiking, a hat, sunscreen, and insect repellent. Also bring a camera, tripod (if you have one) and plenty of film and a drink if you wish. This trip will be held rain or shine. If you want to have a picnic on the farm, bring a bag lunch.

Wednesday, September 14, 6:30 PM, Ames High Prairie Walk

The Central Iowa Prairie Network is holding this evening walk on the prairie. Located on the west side of Ames High School at 20th and Ridgewood- follow the drive around the north end of the school.

Saturday, September 17, 7:30 AM, Chichaqua Wildlife Area

Join members of Big Bluestem Audubon for a morning of birding at this diverse 1500 acre area near Elkhart, Iowa. Meet at 7:30 AM at the I.S.U. Design Center Parking lot (off Sheldon Ave.) It takes about 1/2 hour to get to the site.

Saturday, September 17, 4 PM - A.C. Morris Prairie Seed Harvest

The Friends of Walnut Creek National Wildlife Refuge are sponsoring this potluck supper and seed harvest. At 4:00 PM there will be a pot-luck, music and games at the Mariposa Recreation Area north of Newton, Iowa. At 5:30, participants will walk or ride to the A.C. A NOTE FROM OUR PAST PRESIDENT



To get to the Mariposa Recreation Area, take I-35 south to I-80. Continue east on I-80 for 30 miles to the second Newton exit. Go north into Newton to County T 12. Continue east and north on T 12 for 7 miles. Bring a pot-luck dish and a table setting for the supper. Bring garden gloves, hand shears and paper bags for collecting seeds.
