1970 CHRISTMAS COUNT

The Ames Christmas Bird Count conducted on December 27, 1970 was highly sucessful. Last year 48 species were seen and this year 47. Other counts in Iowa were down considerably from last year. The birds seen were: Mallard 3, Sharp-shinned Hawk 1, Red-tailed Hawk 1, Bobwhite 7, Pheasant 8, Mourning Dove 26, Screech Owl 24, Horned Owl 26, Barred Owl 5, Saw-whet Owl 1, Kingfisher 2, Yellow-shafted Flicker 5, Red-shafted Flicker 1, Red-bellied Woodpecker 33, Red-headed Woodpecker 4, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker 2, Hairy Woodpecker 13, Downy Woodpecker 65, Horned Lark 1, Blue Jay 70, Crow 93, Black-capped Chickadee 113, Tufted 71 Titmouse 17, White-breasted Nuthatch 68, Red-breasted Nuthatch 5, Brown Creeper 20, Winter Wren 1, Brown Thrasher 2, Robin 2, Golden-crowned (sp) 45, Western Meadowlark 1, Red-winged Blackbird 1, Rusty Blackbird 2, Grackle 1, Cardinal 79, Purple Finch 8, Goldfinch 30, Slate-colored Junco 302, Oregon Junco 1, Tree Sparrow 189, Harris' Sparrow 2, Fox Sparrow 3, Swamp Sparrow 2, Song Sparrow 41, for a total of approx. 2885 individuals. We had 22 observers in several parties plus seven persons who turned in feeder reports. The owl calling technique with new state records set for both screech and horned owls.
