FIELD TRIP

NORTHEAST IOWA

GROVE FIELD TRIP REPORT

Once again, we had a very foggy morning for the start of our field trip on September 18. The fog and light rain lifted slightly for parts of the morning but it was not a day to see hawks. Still, eight members of our Chapter walked the low trails and parking area of Grammer Grove Park, delighting in good views of numerous species of warblers (approximately 8).

PRAIRIE STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Three good opportunities to help restore central Iowa prairies are available this month. First, at the Walnut Creek Wildlife Refuge, south of Prairie City, there will be seed collecting "Stewardship Saturdays" on October 9 and 23. The collecting will be done from 10 AM until 3 PM, but come for part of the day if you wish. You may want to bring gloves and pruning shears, if you have them. Also, bring a sack lunch and a beverage. The refuge staff will help vou identify seed heads to be collected. The Refuge also needs help in collecting Canada Wild Rve in central Iowa. Their goal is 1000 lb. of it! If you can help by collecting seed heads along roadside right-of-way, please give Dave Aplin a call at 994-2415. Dave will give you further instructions on what and how to collect and how to send it. The Walnut Creek Refuge is located by going two miles south of Prairie City on Hwy. S6G, then one mile west on S. 96th Ave. W. then 3/4 mile south on W. 109th St. S.

The second opportunity is a little closer to Ames. On Saturday October 23, from 1:30 PM - 5:30 PM, the Central Iowa Prairie Network will be removing trees (mostly eastern red cedar) from the Raymond/Rolling property along the Skunk River north of Ames. They especially need anyone with a chain saw who could help out. Contact Tom Rosburg at 377-2930. Rain date in Sunday, October 24. Directions to work site: Go north on Hwy. 69 to the Peterson Pits turnoff. Go east to the first gravel road south, then south to the first mailbox and lane on the east side of the road. Follow the lane back to the Rolling home.

SOME NEWS ON MEMBERSHIP FROM PETER BERLE

Peter Berle. President of the National Audubon Society, reports in his last letter to Chapter leaders some interesting information on membership. Over the summer, a Roper survey was completed to answer some questions regarding a decline in Audubon membership. Among Roper's findings were a strong and steady support for environmental causes. Also, the membership decline pointed to a need for more aggressive renewal efforts, a need for more targeted membership acquisition, and a need to retain current support while attracting younger members. The AUDUBON magazine was identified as the key vehicle for education of members. The top six reasons given by members for joining Audubon were:

- Protecting birds and other wildlife
- Knowing membership fee will help to protect environment
- Furthering knowledge of the natural world
- Keeping informed on environmental issues
- Receiving AUDUBON magazine
- Influencing the nation's environmental policy

To arrest the membership decline, Audubon will be stepping up its efforts to renew members.
