Your mention of the Redpolls, Snow Buntings and and other Arctic visitors sounds good but we have seen none of them here. Guess they failed to get by your collecting gun. Bob shot another Lapland Longspur and a Hoyts Horned Lark (?) a few days ago and I sent them to Kubichek. Bob thought it a Hoyts but I didn't so we will let Kubichek settle it for us. Would have sent them to you but thought he might want the skins for his museum. If you ever come down through this way be sure to drop in and see me.
