# DATA ON IOWA RED-TAILED HAWKS

During 1932 and 1933 the winter carried on a survey of Iowa specimens of birds with the view in mind of determining the exact (identification) of each for recording or summarizing them in the "Revised List of the Birds of Iowa" (1933).
