At any rate do what you can, and send back either the present manuscript or a better one as promptly as convenient. Stephens asked to have the final copy in his hands by the fifteenth, but I plainly see that I cannot get it to him by that time.

I am to have a talk with Mr. Darling today, relative to the Biological Survey, and other things, and will let you know of anything significant that comes up.
