I think your comment on the North Dakota predator situation is especially good, and I am taking the liberty of sending a copy of it to Dick Pough. I do not regard your statements as in any important degree countering my own, but rather supplementing them in a very effective way.

Just to clear up one misunderstanding: I do not mean to imply that the pheasants eat sweet clover. I am told that in the Red River Valley they depend on it for cover and that its occurrence is purely accidental. I was in the same predicament as yourself, namely that it would take a treatise to really cover Pough's question.

I concede your point that northwest Iowa results are, by and large, transferable.
