Dear Bill:

I enclose herewith a typed copy of Albert Gastrow's Journal for the winter of 1943-44, together with two summary sheets giving the fall and spring censuses for quail and for miscellaneous species respectively.

I earlier sent you a summary up to February 15 which has appeared in the Wisconsin Wildlife Research quarterly for April, pp. 1-2. Should you want a complete summary for the Bulletin, Kabat or I will be glad to write one.

Kabat typed this copy at home and was unable to make adequate carbons. Since you probably need copies anyhow, may I ask that a copy be sent Errington, and also one to me? Kabat already has a copy.

According to Walter Scott's letter of May 3, 1940, Paul Errington has been acting as the repository for the original journals in the past, so will you please forward this one to him after the copies have been made?

Just to clarify the whereabouts of the journals, we have the following which we borrowed during the past year:

These are now in my possession and will be actively used by Kabat through the summer until he leaves for military service in September, at which time they will be sent to Errington, unless he needs them before that.
