Went over to Fern and Odessa lakes last week - a 10 mi. hike. They were very exquisite bits of scenery. We passed thru a forest which would make one think of Mich. Minn. or Wisconsin woods if the mountain tops were not visible now ^{and} then.

I expect to climb Long's Peak next week.

My mother said they enjoyed your visit at the farm.

I am glad that Mrs. Pammel and you are visiting the South. I hope you will visit my uncle at Houston (3103 Louisiana St.) I am sure that Uncle Robert would be glad to see you at Lufkin too - if you are in that vicinity. I trust you will have a good trip.
