The long-range health effects of fallout from the above-ground nuclear tests conducted by the United States will be the subject of joint hearings of the Senate Health and Scientific Research Subcommittee, the Senate Judiciary Committee (both chaired by Senator Edward M. Kennedy), and the House Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, chaired by Congressman Bob Eckhardt, to be held Thursday, April 19, 1979, at 8:30 a.m. in Suites A and B of the Salt Palace in Salt Lake City, Utah.

The hearing will explore what is known about the levels of fallout in populated areas at that time, what the health effects have been, if any, and what the residents of Utah feel about the way the whole matter has been handled by the Federal Government.
