I don't think any Iowa specimens are preserved. 4. W. h. w. g. Scoter - pair seen 11/30, Lutescent. 80 bridge near La Claire by Fred Lorenzen, outdoor & writer of Quad City Times - experienced hunter - at close range & near the Iowa shore. My records - Co. Loon, one at Loch 13 & one at Sabula Nov. 2. Hairy records - Cared W. b. - 4 - Sep. 19, Loch 15 - near mid-river - 20x scope.
