Tom,

Quick letter to say hi and that I hope everything is going well for you this year. This year had to be one of the **worse** spring migrations in recent memory! Several good birds were found, especially early, but there are big holes in my yearly list. Hopefully, I can catch them on the way south.

I see that the April 25 Blackpoll is a record early date. The bird was seen briefly - 5 seconds - the details were color, black and white, black cap on head, white cheek, white breast and belly, streaked on the side and back, the orange legs were prominent.

Who would think that this year there would be any late dates? The May 25 Palm warbler is the third latest, I think. the bird was about 15 feet up in a tree - kind of uncommon - pumping its tail. the chestnut cap to head, yellow eyebrow, throat, undertail coverts, white belly with black streaks on side.

If you need more information or would prefer a standard rare bird report, let me know, otherwise I'll continue early and late (except out of season birds) dates in this manner. My email address is pkernzen@pionet.net.
