pelican, white: I got 2 independent reports of a
white pelican in Iowa City area. (Paul
Milkman, Dick Decastren).

bald eagle: 1 imm 8/23 (early) Coralville Res.
1 imm 10/18 Mark Twain Refuge

accipiter: scarce

merlin 1 9/12 Coralville Res.

kestrel: scarce (only 2 8/16 - 11/16)

shorebirds: The very dry summer dried up many
ponds and swales, but created lots of mud
on the Coralville Reservoir, with the result that
it held many shorebirds until 10/1 when the water
level was raised. After that, only 1 pond held
any birds, and these stayed around until
the end of Oct. (Records connected by dotted
line).

phalarope, N. 1 8/31 Coralville Res.

nighthawks present in Iowa City until 8/31 in
good numbers - a migrating flock of 200 was
seen 8/31 - thereafter there were only a few

flickers: a "hybrid" flicker was seen 11/1 in
Iowa City - had head pattern of "red-shafted"
but a faint red crescent on nape. wings and

+ tail linings were red.

Passerines generally: except for swallows, this has been a poor migration for them. Low numbers most marked for insect-eaters (thrushes, warblers, vireos, Kinglets); sparrows picked up in late Oct. The dry summer may have held insect populations down. A few migrant warblers as early as 8/16 - did they all go south early? (I was away the 1st part of Aug.).

bluebirds: only record 8 8/16 Coralville Res.

nuthatches: 1 red-breast 10/18 Mark Twain Refuge.

wrens: S-b marsh locally common in high-grass areas near Coralville Res in Aug. Carolina wren: 4 in Iowa City in Nov (saw 2 in Hickory Hill Pk, got 2 more reports from different areas of Iowa City: FW Kent, N Halmi, M. Glosson).

missed altogether: rusty blackbird, sapsucker, towhee.

warblers: 1 Cape May 9/14 Cedar Bluff; Nick Halmi has seen 3 others.

winter finches: purple finches around in small numbers but ahead of last year.; 2 siskins 9/16; M. Glosson reports evening grosbeaks (11/8-11/15) Coralville Reservoir.

icterids: bobolinks stayed late (to 8/31) at the Coralville Reservoir.
