Dear Dr. Halmi:

Following is a list of my observations during summer 1976.

Great-blue Heron--many observations.

Great Egret--15 on 24 June and 13 on 26 July near Lansing. Least Bittern--1 on 22 June and 1 July at Cardinal Marsh.

Common Pintail -- 1 male on 1 July at Cardinal Marsh.

American Wigeon -- 2 males on 1 July at Cardinal Marsh.

Red-shouldered Hawk--2 immatures on 2 July at L&D #9, 2 immatures on

15 July near Effigy Mounds, 1 adult on 2 Aug in the Yellow River Forest. Broad-winged Hawk--2 in the Yellow River Forest during June and July.

Bald Eagle--1 adult on 8 Aug near L&D #9.

Osprey -- 1 on 16 June at Cardinal Marsh.

American Kestrel -- found at 7 different locations during June, becoming more numerous in late July.

Wild Turkey -- 1 brood of 5 young and another of 3 young on 2 Aug in the Yellow River Forest.

Am. Woodcock -- found in 6 different locations in the Yellow River Forest and near Marquette during June and July.

Common Snipe -- 2 on 13 June at Hayden Prairie, 1 on 5 Aug at Cardinal Marsh. Upland Sandpiper -- found in four different locations in Winneshiek and

Howard counties during June.

Lesser Yellowlegs--1 on 1 July at Cardinal Marsh.

Yellow-billed Cuckoo--Many observations during the summer. Yellow-bellied Sapsucker--found in 9 different locations in Allamakee and Clayton counties during the summer. Young being fed by parents at some locations during June.

Acadian Flycatcher -- Commonly observed in suitable habitat.

Least Flycatcher -- found in six locations in Allamakee and Clayton counties during June and July ...

Olive-sided Flycatcher--1 on 6 Aug in the Yellow River Forest, 2 near Marquette on 15 Aug.

Red-breasted Nuthatch -- 1 on 16 Aug in the Yellow River Forest, 1 on 19 Aug at Cardinal Marsh.

Brown Creeper -- 2 on 6 Aug in the Yellow River Forest, 1 on 7 Aug at Effigy Mounds.

Winter Wren--1 seen and heard on 30 June and 2 July in the Yellow River Forest.

Carolina Wren -- found at five different locations in Allamakee and Clayton counties during the summer.

Wood Thrush -- commonly observed.

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher -- numerous observations, 2 nests were found.

Cedar Waxwing -- quite common in groups of 2 to 6.

Loggerhead Shrike -- no observations.

White-eyed Vireo--1 heard near Marquette on 16 July, 1 seen and heard on 10 Aug in the Yellow River Forest.

Bell's Vireo -- I during June and July in the Yellow River Forest.

Black and White Warbler -- 1 on 13 Aug and 16 Aug in the Yellow River Forest. Blue-winged Warbler--numerous observations but down slightly from last year.

A nest with four eggs was found in the Yellow River Forest on 21 June. Yellow Warbler -- Not as numerous as a few years ago but still commonly seen.

Magnolia Warbler -- 1 on 13 Aug in the Yellow River Forest.

Black-throated Green Warbler -- 1 on 13 Aug at Pikes Peak State Park. Cerulean Warbler -- 12+ observed in Allamakee county during the summer. Blackburnian Warbler -- 1 on 15 Aug near Marquette and 2 on 16 Aug in the Yellow River Forest.

Chestnut-sided Warbler--4 on 13 Aug and 2 on 16 Aug in the Yellow River

Northern Waterthrush--1 on 6 Aug and 16 Aug in the Yellow River Forest.. Louisiana Waterthrush -- found in five different locations in Winneshiek,

Allamakee, and Clayton counties during the summer.

Mentucky Warbler -- down slightly from last year. Mourning Warbler -- 1 on 15 Aug near Marquette.

Yellow-breasted Chat -- 1 in the Yellow River Forest during June and July. Hooded Warbler -- 1 seen and heard in the Yellow River Forest on 6&7 July,

2 (male and female) on 7 Aug at Effigy Mounds.

Canada Warbler -- 1 on 15 Aug near Marquette and 1 on 16 Aug in the Yellow River Forest.

Am. Redstart--common

Orchard Criole -- 3 on 23 June and 1 on 9 July near L&D #9.

Rufous-sided Towhee--common

Swamp Sparrow -- 5 at Cardinal Marsh during June and July.
