NOTE: assume these birds have been documented by original observer. However, some notes are written below and **two photographs (taken by Reid)** are being sent under separate cover.

Pam's notes: Heard first from 1/8 mile away. Located

bird in top of large cottonwood tree about 75 feet off the ground. Observed sitting and flying. Looked like Mourning Dove but was paler; no wing spotting; wide white terminal band under tail with black undertail. Collar was thin with white edges. Primaries were dark; wing feathers looked scalloped; tail was square. Lighter underwing linings which contrasted with dark primaries. Call was coo COO coo; coo COO coo. Observed from 3:10 - 3:30 p.m.; 87°; light winds; partly cloudy skies. Habitat: Suburban -- on edge of golf course with homes close by. Farmed fields about 1/8 mile away.

Very black throat; two white wing slashes.
