### FIELD REPORTS - 5 PRING 1997

## GENERALTRENDS

Few shorebirds, other than yellowlegs, were seen because of the lack of mudflats. The passerine migration was late again this year due to the unrelenting cold weather and strong north winds. A few examples of late arrival dates in Winneshiel County are E. Wood Pewee on 23 May, Gray Cathird on 9 May, Warbling Vireo on 14 May, and Red-eyed Viveo on 19 May. The first widespread movement of passerines was not noted until 12 May. A good variety of warblers was found from then until nearly the end of the month. No large waves of migrants were noted, and their occurance was checkered. Some localities seemed devoid of birds while others (out of the wind) held many migrants. Vireus were scarce and quite late. During May, feeder watchers were delighted with the appearance of many Rose-breasted Grosbeaks, Indigo Buntings, Baltimore Orioles, and even Scarlet Tanagers. Waterfowl migration peak (16 species) was on 17 Apr. at Cardinal Marsh.

# SPECIES DATA

All records, except where noted, are from Winneshiek County and include the following localities: Burn Oak (Willowglen Nursery and Winters Pond), Decorah, Cardinal Marsh, and Lake Meyer County Park.

### SPECIES DATA

American White Pelican: The only report was a flock of 14 at Cardinal Marsh on 16 May (Lee Zieke). Black-crowned Night Heron: I was seen at Cardinal

Marsh on 1 May.

Blue-winged Teal: High count: at Cardinal Marsh on 15 May.

Northern Shoveler - High count: 60 at Cardinal Marsh on 17 Apr.

Cooper's Hawk: I was seen at Decorah on 16 May. Sandhill Crane: 5 were fly-overs at Cardinal Marsh on 24 Apr.

Greater Kellowlegs: Peak was 20 at Cardinal Marsh on

29 Apr.

V Solitary Sandpiper: First: 1 at Decoration 30 Apr.

Most and last: 4 at Burr Dakton 17 May.

Least Sandpiper: My only record: 14 at Cardinal Marsh on 15 May.

Bonaparte's Gull: On 3 May, 14 were at Fish Farm Mounds Pond (New Albin), Allamakee Co. and Il on a V gravel pit pond in Decorah.

Whip-poor-will: I was seen at Cardinal Marsh on 15 May. Vellow-bellied Sapsucker: 10 were found at Effigy Mounds,

Allamatee Co. on 10 May.

Olive-sided Flycatcher: 2 were heard and seen at Decorah on 20 May.

Empidonax: Many, mostly silent, were seen from 12 to 25 Mar. High count: 16 at Cardinal Marsh on 19 May. Only Least was heard singing. Dennis Carter SPRING 1997

<u>Vellow-bellied Flycatcher</u>: I was seen at Decorah on 25 May.

Winter Wren: First: 2 at Late Meyer on 9 Apr. One was singing at Effigy Mounds, Allamattee Co. on 10 May.

Gray-checked Thrush: more than usual.

Solitary Viveo: First: lat Lake Meyer on 12 May.

Last: 1 at Decorah on 21 May.

Philadelphia Viver: A singing bird was seen at Decorah on 31 May. A singing Red-eyed Viveo was seen nearby for comparison.

Golden-winged Warbler: First: 1 at Late Meyer on 12 May.

Last: 1 at Decorah on 29 May.

Orange crowned Warbler: Last: 1 at Decoration 16 May. Northern Parula: More than usual. Last: 1 at Burr Oak on 21 May.

<u>Yellow Warbler</u>: High count: 32 at Cardinal Marsh on 19 May.

<u>Chestnut-sided Warbler</u>: Last was I in Winneshiet Co. on

30 May (Susan Anderson).

Cape May Warbler: I missed this species. Tex Sordahl saw 6 in an apple tree in his yard in Decorah on 18 May, Blackburnian Warbler: Several reports during the third to fourth weeks in May. I saw 2 feeding in a plowed field at Cardinol Marsh on 19 May.

Blackpoll Warbler: Last: a singing male at Decorah on 29 May.

Palm Warbler: Most even in Iseason for me. First: 9 at Decorah on IMay.

High count: 40 at Cardinal Marsh on 15 May. Last: 6 at Cardinal

Marsh on 19 May.

#### SPECIES DATA

Prothonotory Warbler: A female at Lake Meyer on 12 May was only my third individual for Winneshiek Co. Larry Reis saw two along the Upper Iowa River at Lime Springs, Howard Co. on 17 May.

Wilson's Warbler: First: 2 at Decorah on 11 May.

Canada Warbler: Fire Found in Winneshiek Co.,

from 19 to 29 May.

Summer Tanager: I alosely observed a female at the feeders (at oranges) at Willowglen Nursery, Burr Oak, Winneshiek Co., on 17 May. According to Lindsay Lee and Lee Zieke, it had been present since 6 May and was not seen after the 17th. The bird was a rich gold-orange color with gray wings, tail, and bill. In contrast to Scarlet Tanager, it had no olive in the plumage. I had previously seen this species in North Carolina. One of the observers for the 17th, had seen the species in Texas, a few weeks earlier. This is my first record for NE Iowa, but I note that it has recently beer reported each spring in SE Minnesota.

Clay-colored Sparrow: 2 were at Cardinal Marsh on 15 May.

Lincoln's Sparrew: I found the most ever in I season.

First: ( at Decorah on 1 May. High count: 5 in Winneshiet, Co.

on 15 May. Last: 1 at Burr Ock on 17 May.

White-throated Sparrow: Last: 1 at Decorah on 29 May.

Harris' Sparrow: I had several reports, for more than usual,
of birds at feeders during May.
