Fall 1998 field reports Jim Dinsmore (JJD)

Note on weather: Numerous students and colleagues mentioned to me the large number of waterfowl, especially Snow Geese that they saw migrating south (or at least trying to) on 10/11 Nov. Those days were highlighted by high winds with winds generally in the range of 30-40 mph with gusts to 60 mph. It was clear that there was a massive migration of waterfowl south as that storm moved across the state. Probably of major importance for waterfowl was the heavy snow that accompanied the storm in the Dakotas and northern Iowa.

Prairie Falcon-1 near Ames, 8 November large falcon seen chasing shorebirds, killed snipe and watched feeding on it; much larger than the snipe and clearly a prairie/peregrine sized bird rather than a Merlin Studied at length while on the ground and feeding. Bird ca 150 yards away, seen through spotting scope. Overall color a very pale tan/brown. Never could see underwing markings but head markings noted carefully. Mustache stripe quite distinct and faint dark ear patch. There was some light color between back of eye and the ear patch which indicates prairie rather than peregrine. Also the overall pale color was much lighter than the color found on peregrines. Watched from about 2:35-3:00, much of that time bird was perched on ground feeding. Eventually flew away.
