I am sending a few observations of the summer season 1976 for the Field Notes in the Iowa Bird Life. I understand you are preparing the notes that was done formerly by Woodward Brown.

- Upland Sandpiper (formerly Upland Plover) Noticeably fewer this year. One or two at a time only this year and some days none. Previous years seen and heard every day and frequently several at once.
- Loggerhead Shrike. Usual numbers. In July would see one or more shrikes on any 5 miles of country road.
- Bobolink- Nesting here up to July1 3 or h in a pasture
  Yellow Warbler- Seen around our lake here. Mrs. DeLong also
  banded one and reports several sightings.
- Short billed Marsh wren- Appeared here in July and August.
  Nesting in 4 areas on my farm. Some years absent.
  Drought in Minnesota and northern range may have sent them here this year.

This is a short list, and it may be too late this time. Will try to supply some notes from now on.
