SOUTHWEST IOWA FIELD NOTES AUG. -- NOV., 1976

- Common Goldeneye -- several on Viking Lake, Nov. 8 Jean Braley and Ruth Phipps. This is the second time I've seen goldeneye in this area; so I would say they are uncommon.
- Common Flicker, Red-shafted race. I saw a red-s. flicker at the same location twice, and Jean Braley saw one with-in a mile of this place. These flickers are reported occasionly but they are not common. Manti, Sept. 21
- Hairy Woodpecker -- This bird appeared at my suet feeder and is the only one I saw through this period. Nov.-21
- Brewer's Blackbird -- Riverton area, 11-27 Marie Spears & Ruth Phipps I consider the Brewer's an uncommon migrant.
- Rufous-sided Towhee, (spotted race). I banded two and saw another one. One bird banded 9-29 the other 10-12.
- Henslows Sparrow -- Marie Spears and I saw this bird on the Riverton refuge on 11-27. It was surprising to see this sparrow at such a late date, and I consider it rare in this area. Marie and I checked and double checked all identifing marks the rufous wings, shape of the head, etc, and we kept coming out Henslow's. The stripped head was another important identifing mark.

White-crowned Sparrow -- Marie Spears and I saw a flock of at least 27 birds on 11-27 on the Riverton refuge. It's awuncommon migrant.
