Pied-bill first seen in numbers 29 Sept.

Little Blue Heron. Imm. at Brenton's Slough 23 Sept. Dick Mooney

*Black-crown none

Geese few

Ducks Few. Mostly Mallards vs Scaup in majority last year

*Accipiters few if any

*Red-shouldered none

*Kn. Harrier none

*Osprey none

*Kestrel probably normal numbers for the season

Waders few

*Yellow-billed Cuckoo none or very few

Kingfisher Thought more than usual in fall Dick Mooney

Flickers good migration

Red-headed unusual numbers of imm. seen Nov. and Dec.

Boreal Chickadee present 16 Nov. to now 6 Dec. (longer note)

Winter Wren seen 2 Oct. Dick Mooney

Robins good migration, 100 or more at Jester Park 7 and 19)ct. Brown

Brown Thrasher about 15 in H. Peasley yard 21 Sept. Some until 24th

Yellow Warbler few

Am. Redstart few

Harris Sp. more than usual 1 flock of 25
