Dear Dr. Halmi.

I'm not sure of the format that you wish for the field reports, but will try to submit any thoughts as I have to Woody over the past years and if you desire a different type of report please inform me.

Generally the summers was not that significant. I did observe some 73 species while making 9 breeding bird survey, down 3 species from last years similar runs. Weather conditions may have been the major contributing factor (wind). The best observations, as far as I was concerned, were 8 blue grosbeaks on 3 survyes along with 4 western kingbirds on 2 surveys in northwest Iowa.

## Other comments:

- Ducks Very few during summer, best observation was 150 bluewings last Sunday morning on a pond near Kamrar.
- Hawks Fair number of red-tails, kestrels fewer, and only one marsh all summer. A nesting broad-wing near Webster City.
- Game birds Pheasants in good numbers in northwest, west central and north central parts of the state. Large numbers of bobwhite below U. S. 30. Partridge about usual.
- Sandpipers Upland in Sioux and Kossuth during BBS along with a few spotted and yellowlegs.
- Cuckoos Nothing unusual. More yellows than black-bills.
- Owls Good numbers of horned and barred near Webster City.
- Flycatchers Impressed with the number of peewees in rural areas throughout the summer, never really had observed that before.
- Swallow One cliff near Fort Dodge on June 16 seemed out-ofplace. Flocks of cliffs first week in August as usual.
- Mimics More catbirds than previous summers.
- Thrushes One bluebird near Algona in June-my only observation.
- Blackbirds No orchard orioles this spring or summer.
- Tanagers None
- Sparrows, etc. few rose-breasted, large number of goldfinches the past few weeks. Lark sparrow in Warren co. on 7/19 was my first summer observation.

Just a note. During the summer I hold a job as a crop insurance adjustor, so do get a fair chance to see quite a bit. During the rest of the year I am a classroom teacher.
