<u>Circumstances:</u> Sighted as I drove across the dam. I thought this was going to be a early Common Loon, but when I scoped it I immediately realized it was a Pacific Loon.

<u>Description:</u> The loon had a very defined white face and foreneck. The crown and nape were grayish and lighter than the darker back. The bill was straight and smaller than what I would have judged a Common's to be. The eye was entirely within the dark area of the crown. The sides of the neck were separated from white and gray by vertical black line. The bird had a faint, but visible dark strap running across the neck at the base of the chin.

Description of voice: n/heard

<u>Similarly appearing species:</u> Common and Red-throated both have a dark nape than back and have white above the eye.

Distance: 75 to 150 yds

Optical equipment: 8x40 binoculars & a Kowa 20x to 60x spotting scope.
