Description of bird(s): I was scanning the west end of the lake when I noticed three loons swimming together. One of them was clearly different. This bird was slightly smaller, but was markedly different in other ways. The bill was much stouter, shorter, and black. The neck pattern was very clean cut: foreneck white, forehead, crown, and back of neck black and separated from the foreneck by a thin darker line. The bird also had a thin dark line across the middle of the throat (a chinstrap). The mantle and wings were black, contrasting with the slightly paler head and neck. The lack of any pale markings on the upperparts seemed to indicate the bird was an adult in basic plumage.

Similar species and how eliminated: The size, neck pattern, bill shape, and chinstrap eliminate other species of loons.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were excellent with the sun behind us. Estimated viewing distance was 150m. I used a 20-60x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen numerous Pacific Loons in Iowa, plus hundreds in California.
