Also describe voice and behavior. I was following up on a refort from ED THELEN OF A PACIFIC LOON ON BIG SPIRIT LAKE. I SAW A LOON FROM A LONG DISTANCE AND WITH THE SCOPE I COULD SEE THE ROUNDED HEAD SHAPE AND SMALL BILL. I DROVE TO THE WEST SIDE OF THE LAKE AND GOT THE BIRD IN GOD HEAT AT ABOUT 100 YDS. I COULD SEE THE LIGHT GRAY CROWN AND NAPE WHICH CONTRASTED WITH THE DARK CRAY THAT RAN FROM THE BILL THRU THE EYE, DOWN THE SIDE OF THE NECK TO THE DARK BACK, AND FORMED A DISTINCT EDGE WITH THE WHITE CHIN, THROAT AND BELLY, AS THE BILD PREENED, I COULD SEE A DARK CHIN STRAP.
