Gary called to report that:

1. A Sandhill Crane had landed on his pond in NE Boone County last night (31 May). He had several cranes do the same a year or so ago and I saw a video of the birds to check the id. They were cranes.
2. He also mentioned that a Spotted Towhee that had showed up in Dec 98 stayed there (home in NE Boone County) through 10 May.

I have the feeling that I might have another item or two. Have a grad student in the field who I haven't heard from for some time but will see what she has been seeing in NW Iowa (Rachel-you met her at Marble Lake access).
