loons, grebes

6-7 common loons and up to 25 horned grebes were on the CoR 10/26-11/7

cormorant

1 double-crested cormorant 10/3 CoR

herons

19 great egrets 9/25 CoR

ducks

10/26-11/7

very few this fall- only sizeable concentrations were a mixed flock of divers on the CoR and a large flock of teal-- probably due to very low water levels

goose, C. 50 9/25 CoR Blue 1 white phase 9/25n CoR bufflehead 3 10/7 CoR goldeneye 6 11/14 CoR teal, b-w. 400 8/27-28 CoR

hawks

sharpshins and braadwings were more abundant than usual, redtails less abundant. bald eagles did not visit the area this fall, possibly because of the low level of the resevoir

shorebirds in general were found in small numbers this fall. There were no mudflats at the shore of the CoR itself, and the oxbows and ponds that attracted birds steadily dried up. The records above are mostly max counts and a few late dates.

A mixed flock of cliff and tree swallows in about equal proportions, containing 5-10,000 birds, was on the CoR 9/5-9/12. By 10/10 it had dwindled to about a few hundred birds.

Birds of this species had been seen in the park in late spring but not in the summer, though the park was not well covered then. The imm raises the possibility of breeding.

General comments

The dry summer and fall, coming on top of last year's drought, produced little good habitat for migrant ducks and shorebirds. On the other hand, the wide flats of the nearly-dry resevoir grew up to dense weeds, ideal habitat for sora rails, marsh wrens, and LeConte's and sharptailed sparrows.

The warbler migration was early and spectacular, but there was a virtual absence of blackpolls. Hummingbirds were abundant, but the brown thrushes were very scarce.

Warblers

migration was early and spectacular, but blackpolls were virtually absent--1 record all fall.
