"Elwen Plegadis Ibeses were reported. No attempt was made to identify the species for that seen on April 18 s. of Russell, s. central Iowa (CS). Those who saw 6 dark Ibeses at Sweet M. on April 26-29 (Larry Farmer, JSc) leaned toward Glossy; 4 birds seen near Churdan, Greene Co. (April 21, DT) were believed to be White-faced, but the description did not include diagnostic field marks. Plegadis ibises observed in spring under favorable viewing conditions should be recognizable as to species (see H. Poughs Prett, Birding, 1976)."
