**Description of bird:** A dark ibis flew in and lit on the shore. It was a long-legged, dark bird with large, long decurved bill that was thicker at the base. The body was iridescent green and rust. The eye was red with white feathering above, below and posterior to the eye. The white was a bit dirty looking and was of uniform thickness around the eye. The legs were carmine throughout.

Voice: not heard.

Similar species: The white feathering around the eye, red eye, and carmine legs eliminate Glossy Ibis.

DETAILS: This Ibis had a glossy green and red body and wings, and the typical large and thick downward curved bill, which appeared dark gray. The eye was red, and entirely surrounded by a pinkish-white border. The legs appeared entirely red.
