Dear Nick -

Gray Jay b. & w. & slide 3. note from Carl Gundorf re. Old Squaw for your info - probably already known to you. Regarding Ch. Counts - Lillian S. says the Cedar Rapids report includes 147 Goldfinches, no Crossbills & add 12 C. Geese for Clinton. Fred Fisher thought they were pinioned but further inquiry showed them to be free flying, wild-reared birds.

Regarding the Pygmy Nt. - talked to Mr. Ely of C. R. on Friday night - a carload from C. R. went to D.M. last Wed & saw it - he said Mrs. Ely was very friendly & the bird most cooperative. No photos taken. Gary Stone said (last Mon - 2/7) he hadn't had time to go out when last in D.M. & talked to Vern Klem about it yesterday & he felt

we should try to get some good photos if at all possible - said early editions of Chan's book are way off on color for either Pygmy or Nt. - wasn't sure which. Talked to Larry Balch last Fri. also re. Nuthatches & he mentioned a Wisconsin Mr. Nt. See Am. Birds Vol. 26, p. 69 & 608 - Milwaukee from Oct. through most of Jan., 1972 - The Passenger Pigeon produced no more detailed information. This perhaps makes an attempt to photograph the bird more important?

A. B. Greber - seen at Lodge 14 late Dec. - Flocks

I seen Jan 22 - on miss. at Cordova Nuclear Plant by Bryan Wielens, a guard who is really an out-of-work biologist - had ornithology in College.

outdoor White fronted Geese - 2 - Cordova Nuclear Plant, Jan 22 - C. T. from Bryan Wielens.

Ducks - Good numbers of Mallards & a few blacks wintered.

One of Wood Duck was just out of Dan. Ch. Ct. area on count day & is now (Feb. 9) near Credit Island, often on the Ill. side where ducks are fed - a Pintail is with it & many Mallards

divers - several hundred Sanderlings wintered between Dan & Cordova Plant - also 75-80 C. Mergansers

Bashawh - bird reported on Oakville Ct. was at Neo Boston, Ill.

Hawks in general - Retraces down-trip to Ames Jan 10 & returns saw only 1 at I 35 & 80 junction. - Average number of Rg-legged Harriers. Am. Kestrels in good numbers within city - 6-8 regularly seen in industrial areas. Bald Eagles in large nos. mid Dec, average Golden Eagle - Saw one 12/14, 1/2/14, imm.

Loreyens saw one in central Scott Co. Feb 6 - imm.

Martin - Dec. 30, East Dav. - Loreyens feeder - seen by Ted, Fred's brother at about 12' feet - captured a House Sparrow

Gulls - Herring + Ring-billed left Dan area in very late Dec, 1 Herring seen Jan 31, flock of 60 on Feb 2 & many Herring since - Ring-billed not looked for carefully as yet.

Drum, Black-legged Kittiwake seen at Nuclear Plant Jan 22/23, carefully observed by Glemons.

Ring Tailed Dove - pair at John Petersen (no relation) yard in W.C. Davenport all fall & early winter. In Jan only 1 seen, found with frozen feet in late Jan - brought into house & wide free flying & not banded.

C. Flicker - albino seen just N. of Dan. City limits - late Jan.

Bil. N. spdp. - still found at Credit Island - P. P. & Walter J. Zwaarder y.b. Sapsucker - one at home - Dec. 29, four Jan 6. P.C. Zwaarder

Tad-bl. Nuthatches - regular at several E. Dav. feeders.

Carolina Wren - one banded home 12/14, three present at time.

Not seen since since mid-Jan, but 1 at Credit Island early Feb, 1-2 Marbleron Oakville Et. at New Boston, Ill. Zwaarder

Grackles - usual numbers of wintering Red-wp. Grackles 1-2,000 500-1,000

White Sparrow - 1 seen at 10', well observed 2/5 - good Loreyens feeding from low feeder - E. Dav. Zwaarder

White-thr. Sparrow - 9 banded home 1/25-2/5 - about 12 banded present

Z. Longspur - about 50 seen Jan 2, 5 mi. N.W. Clinton - none seen 3/13.

Ch. Et day before.

House Wrens - 3 on Jan 10 - Western Scott Co. along I 80. P.S.
