1- 11-27 - Pony Creek Lake, Mills Co. - BP this indivudual was about 50 ft away. It was diving while I saw it for a period of about 5 minutes, coming up to the surface for a second or two at a time. It had a white head with dark gray smudges on the top & lighter gray on the back of the neck. It had a dark gray spot behind the eye. Small dark gray bill. Black back with some white spotting and a white belly.

immature with 2 white spots on face. Long bill sloped down from forehead.

Barrow's Goldeneye- 1 adult male - 11-12 - 15 -IPL ponds - B&LP - 11-12 - Approx. the same size as Common Goldeneyes. Head smaller than Com. Goldeneye. Forehead rises more abruptly from the bill than Com. Goldeneye. It had a white crescent between the eye and the bill; otherwise head was black. The bill was dark, stubby and small. Back was darker overall in comparison to Com. Goldeneye. Black v-shaped mark extended from the back forward to the side of the breast almost to the water line. Belly and underparts white. Bird was in the south pond from 1:15 until it flew into the north pond at 2:20 with 3 Com. Goldeneyes. Was last seen at 3:15.
