Habitat: High Oak bluffs bordering the Des Moines River

Description, visual: Very large raptor, dark with some mottled white under the wings.

behavior: Flying, soaring over the water. Wings not in v configuration.

Similar species and how eliminated: Turkey Vulture. Have narrower wings with distinctly lighter primaries and secondaries than this bird. This bird was larger more heavy bodied. Golden Eagle. This eagle did not have a white band and the base of tail or patch under the wing. Neither a golden head.

Equipment used and existing weather conditions: Unassisted eye but viewed from app. 150 yds at app. 11:30 A.M.. The weather was somewhat windy with intermittent showers but sunny at viewing time with the sun to our backs. This report made 90-10-20.
