The loss of Forney's lake - completely dry & weed-filled - creates a loss in our area that cannot be replaced. There is now no chance of Least Bittern, very few Yellow-hd Blackbirds, no Eared or Western Grebes etc. However, the Least Bittern's loss is Dickcissel's gain. They are abundant in the former lake bed.
