Red-headed Woodpecker

Sedge Wren

Most by far: On 2 June, about 10 days before this species went into the mud, I made a conservative count of 80 SEWR at the northern segment of Hanlontown Slough in Worth County (SSP). I accomplished this count by basically canvassing the entire area. This site consists of a couple of restored wetlands surrounded by a grassland composed of tall, thick Switchgrass and Smooth Brome, with Reed Canary Grass and various sedges dominating in the wetter areas. In other words, this location has lots of suitable Sedge

Wren habitat, and lots of Sedge Wrens are apparently using it. Also, this species was common or fairly common in much of my study region, and up to 10 were found at sites in Dickinson, Hancock, Buena Vista, Cherokee, O'Brien, Clay, Palo Alto and Emmet counties in the month of June (SSP, KLP). Several were also singing on 12 July at the Colo Ponds complex (SSP), and 2 were singing on 29 July at Ada Hayden Park (KLP).

Marsh Wren

Most by far: 36 on 10 June at the Dewey's Pasture/Smith's Slough complex in Clay County (SSP, KLP)

Blue-gray Gnatcatcher

1 calling and singing on 5 June at Wanata SP in Clay County (KLP)

1 calling on 14 July at McFarland Park in Story County (SSP, KLP)

*Baird's Sparrow

1 male documented on 4 June - singing repeatedly at a dry, hilly grassland in northern Cherokee Twp, Cherokee County (*KLP)

*Based on her experience with and knowledge of this and all other *Ammodramus* species, KLP was immediately aware of the significance of this sighting. She therefore took down extensive field notes on this bird, and she is filling out a full documentation.

*Le Conte's Sparrow

3 males on 5-6 June singing at an expansive brome field in Clay County (SSP-details, KLP-details)

Comments: All three birds sang repeatedly - morning and evening - on the 5th and 6th, and two of them were countersinging with one another on the morning of the 5th. Having encountered hundreds of LCSPs in ND and northwest MN over the last five years, we are both quite familiar with this species' song and habits. Also, from conducting hundreds of point counts throughout the grassland regions of MN, we are well aware of the usual southern extent (Wilkin and Otter Tail counties) of the species' summer range and, therefore, how far "out of range" these individuals were. However, these were (apparently) territorial birds that sang repeatedly during each of our visits to the site on the 5th and the 6th. Their behavior was far more reminiscent of Le Conte's Sparrow males that we have observed within the nesting range than it was of migrants. Therefore, as unprecedented as this encounter may be, I still suspect that these LCSPs had intentions of remaining through the summer – or at least until this brome field was mowed for hay.

Clay-colored Sparrow

1 singing (and seen) on 10 June at Freda Haffner Kettlehole Preserve in Dickinson County (SSP). I carefully searched his territory (a patch of short American Plum and Prairie Rose), but I did not find a nest.

Singing Swamp Sparrows were also detected at various locations in Worth, Hancock, Emmet, and Dickinson counties during June (SSP, KLP).

Blue Grosbeak

2 singing on 2 July at Gitchie-Manitou State Preserve in Lyon County (SSP, KLP)

Dickcissel

Throughout central, north-central, west-central, and northwest Iowa, this species was again common to abundant in tall, weedy grassland habitats with high singing perches (tall forbs, shrubs, fences, utility lines, etc.). Compared to 2003, Dickcissel numbers were either about the same or only slightly lower in most counties of these regions (SSP, KLP).

Bobolink

Nesting: A female flushed off of a nest with eggs on 10 June at Cayler Prairie State Preserve in Dickinson County (SSP).

Overall, this species was fairly common in much of north-central and northwestern Iowa (SSP, KLP).

Great-tailed Grackle

2 males on 3 June at a pond near the intersection of the Ocheyedan River and L58 in Osceola County (SSP)

Brown-headed Cowbird & Chipping Sparrow

On 26 July, we observed a Chipping Sparrow feeding two voracious BHCO juveniles at Ada Hayden Park in Story County (SSP, KLP).

Orchard Oriole

Most: 6 (3 m-f pairs) on 2 July at Gitchie-Manitou State Preserve in Lyon County (SSP, KLP)

Nesting: Katy and I observed an adult male feeding newly emerged mayflies to three fledglings near the parking area at McFarland Park on the evening of 14 July.
