 - 2 June 2004, drive through northern Iowa to check yellowhead colonies Flooded creek bottom north of Renwick in Humboldt Co., 9 Great Egrets
- 3 miles north of Corwith in Hancock Co., 19 Franklin's Gulls in flooded field
- 3 miles west of Titonka in Kossuth Co., 36 Franklin's Gulls in flooded field Union Slough NWR, more than 100 yellowheads, mostly in pool west of headquarters and near north end. Also 3 male Northern Shoverlers and 1 male Gadwall at north end
- east of Maynard Reese A, also Alder Flycatcher at Mendelsen Marsh Maynard Reese A.-Redheads-2 males, Ruddy Duck-4 males, 2 females, ca 25-75 yellowheads
- Fort Defiance-Alder Flycatcher, Wood Thrush-seen, Red Squirrel-1 seen
 Hales Slough-ca 50 yellowheads there, probably more than 100 for all of Spirit Lake
 Welch Lake WPA-pair of Ring-necked Ducks, 2 Black Terns over area
- + 2 miles west of Vics Corner, south side of road, in flooded field, Franklin's Gull-25,
- + Ring-billed Gull-125
- + By Little Sioux River, male Great-tailed Grackle flying over marsh
- Lake Park, pond in housing development south of town, Franklin's Gull-250, Ring-billed Gull-20, White-rumped Sandpiper-7
 - Silver Lake-small colony along south side of lake, more on west end, probably a total of 25-100 at lake
 - Rush Lake-little on lake other than a few Canada Geese
 - Meinking Marsh-ca 50 Ring-billed Gulls and 1 Great Egret on one goose island, birds clearly not breeding there and a number of them in juv plumage; at second island,
- counted at least 125 ringbills and probably more, many were down low in vegetation and clearly were at nests. Could see two fairly large downy young gulls along the edge of the island so they have nested this year and have young already.
 - Dan Green Slough-mostly open with little emergent vegetation, could hear yellowheads at the far north end of marsh, also a few at far south end by road, probably fewer than 25 on marsh. Also 3 White Pelicans, 2 cormorants, and 37 Black Terns (migrants)
 - Round Lake-choked with cattails and mostly redwings but some yellowheads on east side and probably a total of more than 100 on marsh
 - Trumbull Lake-emergent vegetation mostly along west shore and at far north end of lake, probably more than 100 yellowheads but most far away
 - Lost Island Lake-5 white pelicans
 - Rush Lake-mostly solid with emergents but many yellowheads obvious, easily the most I have seen on any lake and more that 100 present
- Flooded field near south Twin Lake-Franklin's Gull-33, Ring-bill-1
