## Field Reports - Summer 2003

### GENERAL

The heavy rain during June and <sup>early</sup> July may have had an adverse effect on breeding birds. Waterfowl, except for the ever-increasing Canada Goose, were less numerous than usual at Cardinal Marsh. Bobolinks on nesting territory were gone from Cardinal Marsh by early July. The high water at Cardinal Marsh eliminated most of the shorebird habitat, quite a contrast to recent years. However, conditions were ideal for Yellow-headed Blackbird at Cardinal M., and dozens were present.

### SPECIES DATA

Pied-billed Grebe: A few at Cardinal M. during the period; a brood was seen on 29 Jul.

Green Heron: Up to 4 at Cardinal M. throughout the period.

Turkey Vulture: 40 on 15 Jul at Decorah were riding a thermal; they have roosted on a ridge in town in recent years.

Gadwall: 1♂ on 4 Jun at New Albin, Allamakee Co.

Northern Shoveler: 3♂ <sup>on 4 Jun</sup> at New Albin, Allamakee Co.; 1♂ on 15 Jun at Cardinal M.

Am. Black Duck: 1♂ on 4 Jun at New Albin, Allamakee Co.

Hooded Merganser: 1♂ or Jm. on 2 Jul at Cardinal M.

Ruddy Duck: present through 24 Jul at Cardinal M.; high count: 4♂ 2♀ on 15 Jul with males doing courtship display.

Ruffed Grouse: a hen with 6 chicks was seen on 3 Jun, at close range, near Decorah.

Sora: present throughout period at Cardinal M.

Common Moorhen: 2 adults on 15 Jul at Cardinal M.

American Coot: a few adults + juvenile seen at Cardinal M.

## Field Reports - Summer 2003

Sandhill Crane: 2 adults seen on 29 Jul at Cardinals M.; apparently nesting was unsuccessful.

Least Sandpiper: First: 6 on 15 Jul at Fort Atkinson.

Ring-billed Gull: 1 on 13 Jun at Fort Atkinson was unexpected.

Black-billed Cuckoo: 1 seen on 15 Jul at Cardinal M.; seldom found in recent years.

Yellow-billed Cuckoo: present throughout period in Winneshiek Co.

Ruby-throated Hummingbird: " " " " " "

Red-headed Woodpecker: remains scarce

Yellow-bellied Sapsucker: 1 on 18 Jul near Decorah (Seed Savers Farm) also found along Miss. River in Allamakee Co. where it nests.

Willow Flycatcher: up to 5 birds throughout period at Cardinal M.; also found in Allamakee Co.

Yellow-throated Vireo: present in wooded areas in Winneshiek Co. and two seen carrying nesting material on 5 Jun, near Decorah; also found in Allamakee Co.

Purple Martin: colonies found in Allamakee and Winneshiek counties. (along Miss. River)

Sedge Wren: present in Winneshiek Co. throughout period.

Wood Thrush: " (in wooded areas)

Cedar Waxwing: abundant during Jul in Winneshiek Co.

Blue-winged Warbler: found in a few localities in " ".

Eastern Towhee: found in Allamakee and Winneshiek counties.

Swamp Sparrow: singing birds throughout period at Cardinal M. apparently a family group; begging for food.
