Notes.

^{1.} American Black Duck at McIntosh Wildlife Area, a small marsh adjacent on the north to Clear Lake. This bird had no plumage characteristics to make me suspect it was a hybrid. It was first found May 31, and continued to be seen at the marsh for about the first week of May. Rita Goranson may have a later date in her notes.

^{2.} Yellow-rumped Warbler. Because of the late date, I made a sketch at the location. It's just a scribble, but it shows the bird had the important marks.

^{3.} Male Red Crossbill at Ventura. Description: Large-headed finch with prominent crossed bill, slightly larger and noticeably bulkier than nearby House Finches. Fed by clinging to screened, cylindrical feeder. Head, back, rump, underparts a washed-out burnt reddishorange. Orangish cast to plumage suggests first summer male. Wings and tail solid gray-black, no discernible wing bars. Tail was strongly notched. Forehead and crown appeared lightly streaked, in direction of bill, auricular area had a wash of gray. Eye dark, bill was gray-black, legs seemed gray but with a warm tone depending upon the angle. Viewed from about 200 feet through 8-power

binoculars, bright sunny day, though bird and feeders were in strong shade. I first heard of the bird on July 15.
