

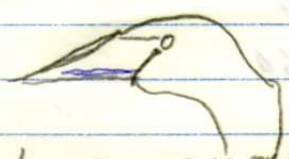

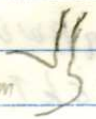


1 has orange or red on left wing

Juveniles definite V pattern on bill between eyes

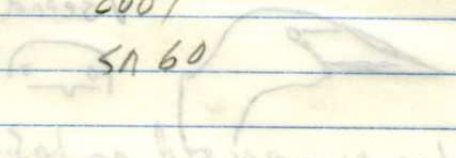
Gradation of shading, neck darkest on the next + underside lightest.
